7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

This project supports the Dark Fiber Lease Agreement signed in March 2012 between the Water Bureau and Portland General Electric (PGE) and will provide a buried fiber link between the Water Bureau facilities at Headworks and Lusted Hill with the Clackamas County Fiber Ring. The project will provide a backup connection between Headworks, Lusted Hill and Interstate and will provide capacity for future supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) upgrades at Headworks that exceed the capacity of the existing microwave system.

This Intergovernmental Agreement is for the design and construction of fiber optic infrastructure by the City of Sandy (Sandy) for the Water Bureau and will include assets that will be turned over to the Water Bureau. The Water Bureau will reimburse Sandy for the Water Bureau's portion of those assets constructed and for its share of the project costs. These improvements will include fiber infrastructure within the right-of-way of SE Bluff Road from approximately SE Dunn Road to SE Bell Road and within SE Bell Road from SE Bluff Road to Sandy High School.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The value of this agreement shall not exceed \$65,000. Funding for the agreement is available in the FY 2012-13 Budget in the treatment program as part of the Headworks Flow Meters Project and has been requested in the FY 2013-14 Budget. The proposed action will not result in a change to the forecast water rates and the project currently has a high level of confidence.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Sandy to design and construct the fiber optic improvements.
