1) Legislation Title: Authorize the rates and charges for water and water-related services during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014 and fix an effective date (Ordinance)

#### 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The Ordinance sets rates and charges for retail and wholesale customers of the Portland Water Bureau. The "typical" residential water customer using 5 hundred cubic feet (ccf) per month will now pay \$27.61, up 3.6 percent from the FY 2012-13 typical bill of \$26.65. The "medium" commercial customer using 100 ccf/month will see a water bill increase from \$362.22 to \$375.30; an increase of \$13.08 or 3.6 percent.

Retail rates are expected to generate approximately \$119.3 million in water sales revenue in FY 2013-14. Retail customers are also expected to pay \$2.5 million from customer late charges. FY 2013-14 wholesale revenues will be \$15.8 million.

Other rates and charges within this Ordinance are expected to generate \$5.0 million for waterrelated services including system development charges, new service installations, customer

a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item? This Ordinance will increase costs for all residential and commercial customers.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved? The water utility rates are designed to generate revenue to cover the cost of providing water. The costs are determined by the budget, which had input through the Public Utility Review Board (PURB), Portland Water Bureau Advisory Committee (BAC), and the City-wide public budget outreach.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? The forecasted increase in water rates started out at 14.8%. Discussion at the BAC, favorable cost drivers and a 5% cut in operations and maintenance resulted in the bureau requesting a 7.8% rate increase. Additional cost changes and cut packages reduced this rate to 3.6% as part of the Mayor's Proposed Budget.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item? The Portland Water Bureau designed the BAC process and the City Budget Office managed the PURB and Citywide budget outreach process.

- 7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS</u>: City Charter Section 11-106 states that "For each fiscal year the Council shall fix rates which provide an estimated income to equal expenses and debt service relating to Water Bonds." Council approval of this Ordinance is necessary to fund the Water Bureau's Adopted Budget.
- FINANCIAL IMPACT: Retail water rates are expected to generate approximately \$119.3 million in water sales revenue in FY 2013-14. Portland retail volume revenue is \$90.1 million and fireline and base charge revenue is \$29.2 million. Retail customers are also expected to pay \$2.5 million from customer late charges. FY 2013-14 wholesale revenues will be \$15.8 million.

In addition, other rates and charges within this Ordinance are expected to generate \$5.0 million for other water-related services including system development charges, new service installations, customer requested new main connections, engineering permit fees, and other miscellaneous utility charges.

The proposed overall average effective retail rate increase is 3.6 percent. These rates include funding a revised Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan, rate increases associated with reduced retail water demand, inflation and previously deferred rate increases. Budget reductions this year include decreases in security function, maintenance of the Bureau's facilities, customer service, distribution system maintenance and administrative support. Reductions also include a transfer of fountains operations and maintenance to Parks.

With a retail rate increase of 3.6%, the fixed customer base charge will increase to \$31.21 per bill (the billed base charge varies depending on the number of days in the billing period). The retail volume rate will increase to \$3.441 per ccf.

The "typical" residential water customer using 5 hundred cubic feet (ccf) per month will now pay \$27.61, up 3.6 percent from the FY 2012-13 typical bill of \$26.65. The "medium" commercial customer using 100 ccf/month will see a water bill increase from \$362.22 to \$375.30; an increase of \$13.08 or 3.6 percent.

Besides setting water volume and monthly base charge rates, this Ordinance provides:

- A fixed low-income discount for qualified single family quarterly billed residential water customers is \$41.40. The discount is 50% of a typical low income customer bill.
- An updated System Development Charge (SDC) rate schedule. SDCs are proposed to increase 20.1 percent overall based on updated meter equivalency and fixed asset data with the typical residential connection (5/8" meter) at \$2,183 up from \$1,817.
- Continuation of the Affordable Housing SDC Fee Waiver Program and waiver for Accessory Dwelling Units.
- Water Fee Schedule for Developer Plan Review of Subdivisions, Services, Hydrants, and Mains. This fee schedule establishes general charges for performance of certain activities by the Portland Water Bureau, including developer plan review of subdivisions, installation of services, activation of services, removal of services, installations of fire hydrants, other service work, and installation of mains. This schedule is subject to exception, limitations, and other conditions contained within the rate ordinance and City Code. These rates are set to reflect full cost recovery.
