Proposed Appointment of Alternate to the Building Code Board of Appeal

The Building Code Board of Appeal (Big Board) has been created under City Code section 24.10.080. It is authorized to interpret City Code Title 24 (Building Regulations) and determine the suitability of alternate materials and methods of construction where practical difficulties or unnecessary hardship would result from a literal interpretation of the Building Code, providing the use of the proposed alternative method or materials is consistent with the intent of the Building Code and provides for equivalent health and life safety. The Big Board rules on issues that have already been reviewed by BDS' administrative appeals board and have been denied by that board.

The Big Board consists of three members and three alternates appointed by the Mayor. One member of the Board must be a competent builder who has engaged in the building business in the City for at least two years immediately preceding appointment, and at least one member must be a competent architect who has practiced in the profession for at least three years. Appointments are for three-year terms, and there are currently no term limits on appointments to the Big Board.

The Board meets on an as-needed basis, usually the second Thursday of the month.

1) Process of Appointing Board Members

The process for appointing a new Board member begins with the filing of an application for membership with the Office of Neighborhood Involvement (ONI). Once ONI receives the applications and conflict of interest forms, it forwards those documents to Terry Whitehill in BDS for review. There has been active on-going recruitment for an alternate member of the Board, to serve as the third (and final) alternate.

2) Current membership

The Big Board currently has three members, including two architects and one builder. There are also currently two alternates; one is an architect, and the other is a builder.

3) Big Board Recommendations

I am recommending **Sam Rodriguez** be appointed as a Building Construction Expertise alternate for a 3-year term to expire May 21, 2016. The following is a summary of Sam's qualifications:

Sam Rodriguez has over 17 years experience as an architect. He has LEED accreditation and has worked on several large projects around Portland, including the Savier Street Flats and the MAC Club site. Given his extensive building experience and architectural expertise, he would be an asset as a Big Board member.

With this proposed appointment there are no vacancies on the Board. Enclosed is an updated membership list for your records.

Building Code Board of Appeals:

The Building Code Board of Appeals is authorized under Portland City Code 24.10.080 and the State of Oregon Structural Specialty Code. This board consists of three members appointed by the Mayor. The members must be qualified by experience and training to make decisions on matters pertaining to building construction. One member must be a builder and one member must be an architect. Appointment to the Board is for a three-year term. The Director of BDS is an ex officio member of the board, and is represented by one of the Senior or Chief Plans Examiners on the BDS staff.

The Building Code Board of Appeals hears appeals of building code issues which are appealed beyond the Administrative Appeals Board. The Appeals Board may affirm, annul or modify the action of BDS on the condition that substantially equivalent safety is provided generally conforming to national standards concerning fire prevention, fire safety measures, and building construction requirements for safety.

This board meets as appeals are received.
