

# Portland Children's Levy Background

In November of 2002, Portland voters approved the Portland Children's Levy (PCL). In the fall of 2008, voters renewed the levy for another five years. The levy has generated an average of approximately \$11 million annually for early childhood, after-school and mentoring, child abuse prevention and intervention and foster care programs. Administrative costs for the fund are capped at 5% of revenues and the fund obtains annual audits to assure compliance with the administrative cap. A copy of the 2008 ballot language for the Children's Levy is attached as Exhibit A.

An Allocation Committee governs the PCL and grants funds to programs serving children and families residing in the City of Portland. The Allocation Committee is comprised of a City Commissioner (Dan Saltzman), a County Commissioner (Deborah Kafoury), a representative of the Portland Business Alliance (Ron Beltz), a citizen member appointed by the County Board (Adrienne Livingston), and a citizen member appointed by the City Council (Julie S. Young).

## **Request for City Council Approval**

PCL is requesting that City Council accept the recommendation of the Allocation Committee to renew competitive grants in the amounts specified in the table in "<u>Exhibit B</u>: Competitive Grant Renewal Amounts."

## **Reduced Revenues for Portland Children's Levy**

As City Council is aware, the creation of a Multnomah County Library District beginning in FY14 will impact revenue for the Children's Levy. The city economist provided revenue projections for the Portland Children's Levy indicating a decline in levy revenues for FY14 to \$8.6 million from \$9.9 million in the current fiscal year. This 13% revenue decline comes after a total reduction of 32.5% over the previous two fiscal years. Reduced revenues are the result of a depressed housing market and compression of city property tax collections brought about by lower real market property values. As a result of the further projected revenue loss for FY14 due to the passage of the Library District, Multnomah County agreed to assume funding and management of eight SUN Community Schools currently funded by the levy through four separate grants to the following agencies: Camp Fire, Metropolitan Family Services, Impact NW and Neighborhood House. This agreement allowed the Allocation Committee to recommend renewing all remaining current grants at current funding levels for the final year of the current Children's Levy.

## **Process for Renewal of Levy's Competitive Grants**

PCL staff provided Committee members with a Grant Performance Summary attached as <u>Exhibit C</u>. Based on the information contained in the Grant Performance Summary, PCL staff recommended renewing all existing grants at current funding levels.
