Under the terms of the IGA each of the participating jurisdictions contributes funding to the operations of the Commission on an annual basis.

Each of the participating jurisdictions contributes to the Commission based on a formula adopted by the Commission.

RECOMMENDATION. Approval of the MHCRC's proposed FY13-14 budget and of Portland's share of the budget in the amount of \$277,299.

BACKGROUND. The Mt. Hood Cable Regulatory Commission (MHCRC) is a quasigovernmental, ORS 190, body, created by Intergovernmental Agreement, among Portland, Gresham, Troutdale, Wood Village and Fairview, and the Multnomah County, to develop and regulate cable services franchise agreements and manage public benefit resources and assets related to the agreements.

Under the IGA, after adopting its annual budget, the MHCRC transmits the budget to each jurisdiction for consideration and approval. The MHCRC's adopted budget becomes effective after approval by the jurisdictions. In its most recent audit of the MHCRC, Moss Adams recommended, among other things, that Portland take action on the annual MHCRC budget in the same manner as the other parties to the IGA. Prior to this time, the other MHCRC member jurisdictions approved the MHCRC budget but the Portland Council approved the MHCRC's budget as a part of the City's budget. For consistency among the parties to the IGA and in response to the auditor's note, the MHCRC is asking for approval by Council of the MHCRC's FY13-14 proposed budget as presented in Exhibit A to the ordinance.

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- II. FINANCIAL IMPACT. The City's FY13-14 contribution to the MHCRC's budget is included in the Mayor's proposed FY13-14 budget in the amount of \$277,299.
