* Authorize a contract between the City and Cascadia Behavioral Healthcare, Inc. to provide mental health services through Project Respond (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

Cascadia Behavioral Healthcare, Inc. currently provides Qualified Mental Health professionals to ride along with uniformed police officers in patrol cars to provide on-scene mental health assessment and evaluation as part of the Police Bureau's Behavioral Health Unit. This partnership also provides linkage to social service resources and uses the Raintree database to identify and follow up with individuals who are generating frequent police contact due to a mental health or emotional crisis. In FY 2012-13, the City added two Qualified Mental Health Professionals to the Behavioral Health Unit. The Bureau wishes to authorize a new contract with Cascadia Behavioral Health beginning July 1, 2013, which reflects all of the changes to the program over the last year.




