* Accept a grant in the amount of \$220,000 and appropriate \$26,000 for Fiscal Year 2012-13 from the Oregon Department of Justice and the Oregon High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas program for Portland interdiction efforts (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

To accept a grant award from the Oregon Department of Justice (ODOJ) and the Oregon High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) program for the Police Bureau's Drugs and Vice Division (DVD) HIDTA Interdiction Team (HIT), which provides efforts in disrupting and dismantling drug trafficking organizations in Multnomah, Washington and Clackamas Counties by employing a multi-agency approach to significantly impact drug availability in the area and the Portland Area Metro Gang Task Force (PAMG) Initiative, which provides the Bureau with the means to assist in the investigation of violent street gang members who are involved in the distribution of controlled substances in the Portland area. The grant period is January 1, 2013, through December 31, 2014.

The ODOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$220,000 for investigative overtime and approved program expenses.

The City will incur fringe and benefit expenses related to sworn overtime. The City will also incur fuel and repair & maintenance expenses for the three City Fleet vehicles provided by the grant and assigned to DVD. There is no match requirement.

The City will, with ODOJ HIDTA grant funds, reimburse the State of Oregon for the cost of all approved personnel and travel expenses, not to exceed \$50,000 for the 2013 HIDTA grant. The ODOJ will reimburse the City for all approved expenses paid to the State of Oregon. The 2013-14 intergovernmental agreement is in process.

Participation in the Initiatives provides a force and resource multiplier, which is of great benefit to the City and the community served by the bureau. Bureau personnel assigned to the Initiatives remain under the supervision of the Portland Police Bureau. Portland police officers may not take action or exercise authority under the agreement if the action or exercise of authority is prohibited by Oregon law.
