- The Civil Rights Act of 1964 is a fundamental piece of federal legislation that prohibits discrimination in a variety of areas.
- Title VI is the section of the Act that prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color and national origin in federally funded programs and activities. It applies to all programs, services and activities of local governments such as the City that received any federal funds.



Advancing equity must be at the core of our plans for the future.

Portland Plan, Adopted by City Council on April 25, 2012 Resolution 36918

Objectives of the Civil Rights Title VI Plan:

- Compliance with Title VI
- Everyone receives the benefits of City programs, services and activities
- Access for persons with limited English proficiency
- Avoid, minimize or mitigate disproportionate adverse environmental effects
- Clear and timely procedures for filing complaints







Administration of the Civil Rights Title VI Plan

- Partnership with bureaus citywide
- Formalized complaint procedure
- Annual reporting
- Triennial reporting
- Evaluation
