This contract is between the City of Portland ("City," or "Bureau") and The Bode Technology Group, Inc., hereafter called Contractor. The City's Project Manager for this contract is Sergeant Cathe Kent.
Effective Date and Duration This contract shall become effective on February 1, 2013. This contract shall expire, unless otherwise terminated or extended, on February 1, 2018.
Consideration (a) City agrees to pay Contractor a sum not to exceed \$350,000.00 for accomplishment of the work. (b) Interim payments shall be made to Contractor according to the schedule identified in the STATEMENT OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE.

 Standard of Care: Contractor shall perform all services under this contract using that care, skill and diligence that would ordinarily be used by similar professionals in this community in similar circumstances.
t. Effect of Expiration Passage of the contract expiration date shall not extinguish, prejudice, or limit either party's right to enforce this Contract with respect to any default or defect in performance that has not been corrected.
B. Order of Precedence This contract consists of these Terms and Conditions, the Statement of Work and Payment Schedule, and any exhibits that are attached. Any apparent or alleged conflict between these items will be resolved by using the following order of precedence: a) these Terms and Conditions; b) Statement of Work and Payment Schedule; and c) any exhibits attached to the contract.
l. Early Termination of Contract a) The City may terminate this Contract for convenience at any time for any reason deemed appropriate in its sole discretion. Termination is effective immediately upon notice of termination given by the City.

Either party may terminate this Contract in the event of a material breach by the other party that is not cured. Before

termination is permitted, the party seeking termination shall give the other party written notice of the breach, its intent to terminate and fifteen (15) calendar days to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within 15 days, the party seeking

termination may terminate immediately by giving written notice that the Contract is terminated.

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5. Remedies and Payment on Early Termination

- (a) If the City terminates pursuant to 4(a) above, the City shall pay the Contractor for work performed in accordance with the Contract prior to the termination date. No other costs or loss of anticipated profits shall be paid.
- (b) If the City terminates pursuant to 4(b) above, the City is entitled all remedies available at law or equity. In addition, Contractor shall pay the City all damages, costs and sums incurred by the City as a result of the breach.
- (c) If the Contractor justifiably terminates the contract pursuant to subsection 4(b), the Contractor's only remedy is payment for work prior to the termination. No other costs or loss of anticipated profits shall be paid.
- (d) If the City's termination under Section 4(b) was wrongful, the termination shall be automatically converted to one for convenience and the Contractor shall be paid as if the Contract was terminated under Section 4(a).
- (e) In the event of early termination the Contractor's work product before the date of termination becomes property of the City.

6. Assignment

Contractor shall not subcontract, assign or transfer any of the work scheduled under this agreement, without the prior written consent of the City. Notwithstanding City approval of a subcontractor, the Contractor shall remain obligated for full performance hereunder, and the City shall incur no obligation other than its obligations to the Contractor hereunder. The Contractor agrees that if subcontractors are employed in the performance of this Agreement, the Contractor and its subcontractors are subject to the requirements and sanctions of ORS Chapter 656, Workers' Compensation.

7. Compliance with Applicable Law

Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations. Contractor agrees it currently is in compliance with all tax laws.

8. Indemnification for Property Damage and Personal Injury

Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents, and employees, from all claims, losses, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney fees) for personal injury and property damage arising out of the intentional or negligent acts or omissions of the Contractor, its Subcontractors, suppliers, employees or agents in the performance of its services. Nothing in this paragraph requires the Contractor or its insurer to indemnify the City for claims of personal injury or property damage caused by the negligence of the City. This duty shall survive the expiration or termination of this contract.

9. Insurance

During the term of this contract, Contractor shall maintain in force at its own expense, the insurance noted below:

- (a) Workers' Compensation insurance in compliance with ORS 656.017, which requires subject employers to provide Oregon workers' compensation coverage for all their subject workers (contractors with one or more employees, unless exempt under ORS 656.027).
- (b) Commercial General Liability insurance with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for Bodily Injury and Property Damage. It shall include contractual liability coverage for the indemnity provided under this contract, and shall provide that City of Portland, and its agents, officers, and employees are Additional Insureds, but only with respect to the Contractor's services to be provided under this Contract:

- (e) There shall be no cancellation, material change, reduction of limits, or intent not to renew any required insurance without 30 days written notice from the Contractor or its insurer(s) to the City.
- (f) Certificates of insurance. The Contractor shall furnish acceptable insurance certificates to the City showing the required insurance coverage. The certificate will specify all of the parties who are Additional Insureds. Certificates and insurers are subject to City approval. Complete policy copies shall be provided to the City upon request. The Contractor shall be financially responsible for all pertinent deductibles, self-insured retentions, and/or self-insurance.

10. Ownership of Work Product

All work product produced by the Contractor under this contract is the exclusive property of the City. "Work Product" includes, but is not limited to: research, reports, computer programs, manuals, drawings, recordings, photographs, artwork and any data or Page 2 of 10

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information in any form. The Contractor and the City intend that such Work Product shall be deemed "work made for hire" of which the City shall be deemed the author. If for any reason a Work Product is deemed not to be a "work made for hire," the Contractor hereby irrevocably assigns and transfers to the City all right, title and interest in such work product, whether arising from copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret, or any other state or federal intellectual property law or doctrines. Contractor shall obtain such interests and execute all documents necessary to fully vest such rights in the City. Contractor waives all rights relating to work product, including any rights arising under 17 USC 106A, or any other rights of authorship, identification or approval, restriction or limitation on use or subsequent modifications. If the Contractor is an architect, the Work Product is the property of the Contractor-Architect, and by execution of this contract, the Contractor-Architect grants the City an exclusive and irrevocable license to use that Work Product.

Notwithstanding the above, all pre-existing trademarks, services marks, patents, copyrights, trade secrets and other proprietary rights of Contractor are and will remain the exclusive property of Contractor.

11. EEO Certification: In the event Contractor provides in excess of \$2,500.00 for services to the City in any fiscal year, Contractor shall obtain EEO certification from the City.

12. Equal Benefits

Contractor must comply with the City's Equal Benefits program as prescribed by Chapter 3.100 of the Code of the City of Portland. The required documentation must be filed with Procurement Services, City of Portland, prior to contract execution.

13. Successors in Interest

The provisions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and approved assigns.

14. Severability

The parties agree that if any term or provision of this contract is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the contract did not contain the particular term or provision held to be invalid.

15. Waiver

The failure of the City to enforce any provision of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the City of that or any other provision.

16. Errors

The Contractor shall promptly perform such additional services as may be necessary to correct errors in the services required by this contract without undue delays and without additional cost.

17. Governing Law/Venue

The provisions of this contract shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of Oregon without reference to its conflict of laws provisions that might otherwise require the application of the law of any other jurisdiction. Any action or suits involving any question arising under this contract must be brought in the appropriate court in Multnomah County Oregon.

18. Amendments

All changes to this contract, including changes to the scope of work and contract amount, must be made by written amendment and approved by the Chief Procurement Officer to be valid. Any amendment that increases the original contract amount by more than 25% must be approved by the City Council to be valid.

19. Business License

The Contractor shall obtain a City of Portland business license as required by PCC 7.02 prior to beginning work under this Contract.

20. Prohibited Conduct

The Contractor shall not hire any City employee who evaluated the proposals or authorized the award of this Contract for two years after the date the contract was authorized without the express written permission of the City and provided the hiring is permitted by state law.

21. Payment to Vendors and Subcontractors

The Contractor shall timely pay all subcontractors and suppliers providing services or goods for this Contract.

22. Access to Records

The Contractor shall maintain all records relating to this Contract for three (3) years after final payment. The City may examine, audit and copy the Contractor's books, documents, papers, and records relating to this contract at any time during this period upon reasonable notice. Copies of these records shall be made available upon request. Payment for the reasonable cost of requested copies shall be made by the City.

23. Audits

(a) The City may conduct financial and performance audits of the billings and services specified in this agreement at any time in the course of the agreement and during the three (3) year period established by paragraph 22. Audits will be conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards as promulgated in Government Auditing Standards by the Comptroller General of the United States Government Accountability Office.

(b) If an audit discloses that payments to the Contractor exceed the amount to which the Contractor was entitled, the Contractor

shall repay the amount of the excess to the City.

24. Electronic Signatures

The City and Contractor may conduct this transaction, including any contract amendments, by electronic means, including the use of electronic signatures.

25. Merger Clause

This Contract encompasses the entire agreement of the parties, and supersedes all previous understandings and agreements between the parties, whether verbal or written.

26. Dispute Resolution/Work regardless of disputes

The parties shall participate in mediation to resolve disputes before conducting litigation. The mediation shall occur at a reasonable time after the conclusion of the Contract with a mediator jointly selected by the parties. Notwithstanding any dispute under this Contract, the Contractor shall continue to perform its work pending resolution of a dispute, and the City shall make payments as required by the Contract for undisputed portions of the work. In the event of litigation no attorney fees are recoverable. No different dispute resolution paragraph(s) in this contract or any attachment hereto shall supersede or take precedence over this provision.

27. Progress Reports: /_/Applicable /X/Not Applicable

If applicable, the Contractor shall provide monthly progress reports to the Project Manager as described in the Statement of the Work and Payment Schedule.

28. Contractor's Personnel: / X / Applicable / / Not Applicable

If applicable, the Contractor shall assign the personnel listed in the Statement of the Work and Payment Schedule for the work required by the Contract and shall not change personnel without the prior written consent of the City, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

29. Subcontractors

The Contractor shall use the subcontractors identified in its proposals. The Contractor shall not change subcontractor assignments without the prior written consent of the Chief Procurement Officer. Failure to use the identified M/W/ESB subcontractors without prior written consent is a material breach of contract.

30. Third Party Beneficiaries

There are no third party beneficiaries to this contract. Enforcement of this contract is reserved to the parties.

STATEMENT OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor has been selected to provide Touch DNA processing services to the City of Portland Police Bureau. The Contractor will analyze buccal cell samples provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will provide a comparison between DNA profiles that are created with the samples. The Contractor will legally certify the DNA results of analyses and comparisons.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY

Collection of evidentiary cellular material from firearms and suspects.

Guarantee of uncontaminated delivery of evidentiary material to the Contractor in strict compliance with guidelines developed by the City and other law enforcement agencies.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR

Maintain and evaluate the use of quality controls throughout the testing process to assure that the procedure is being properly performed.

Ensure that all critical reagents (both biological and chemical) used in the processing of biological evidence are tested to ensure proper function prior to being released to laboratory staff for use in processing DNA samples.

All forensic work and data undergoes a technical and administrative review by a qualified analyst before delivery to the City.

Analyze cellular material in compliance with industry standards.

Provided Testing Materials including: Extraction reagent blanks, STR analysis materials, Applied Biosystems AmpF/STR Identifiler Plus kit, Applied Biosystems and Promega STR typing kits, Profiler Plus, Cofiler, Identifiler, MiniFiler, PowerPlex 16, PowerPlex 16 HS, ABI 3100/3130xl platform, GeneMapperID v3.2.1 (GMID) analysis software.

Create DNA profiles using generally accepted industry standards and procedures.

Provide comparisons between DNA profiles.

Deliver these results in a timely manner.

Be available to certify these results in court, when necessary.

DELIVERABLES AND SCHEDULE

Contractor will return completed case files no later than 30 days after receipt of evidence+.

Week One: Inventory, Screen, Sample

Week Three: Reprocess (if necessary), Analyze, and Review

Week Four: Prepare Shipment, Delivery

The Contractor will provide weekly progress reports and updates of each case.

PROCEDURE

Contractor will utilize Applied Biosystems AmpF/STR Identifier Plus kits and is responsible for maintaining its own supply.

The Contractor's Technical and Administrative Review will include: Profile Comparison and Employee Database checks, Non-Conformance Identification, and Corrective Action Reporting.

COMMUNICATION

Contractor will provide reviews on progress of all Bureau submitted samples when requested.

Direct communication of Bureau is expected with the technical leader, directors, and supervisors at any time

Submission of a forensic case report to PPB and the completion of expert witness testimony as required

ACCREDITATION

The Contractor is expected to maintain the following certifications: Certification as BEO employer, Compliance with Equal Benefits Program, Compliance with City of Portland business tax registration requirements, Maintenance of required insurance, Maintain ISO/IEC 17025 accreditation from American Society of Crime Lab Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board (ASCLD/LAB-International program), and the ANSI-ASQ National Accreditation Board/FQS.

The City will enforce all diversity in workforce and Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business (M/W/ESB) subcontracting commitments submitted by the Contractor in its Proposal. For contracts valued \$100,000 or more, the Contractor shall submit a Monthly Subconsultant Payment and Utilization Report (MUR), made part of this contract by reference, reporting ALL subcontractors employed in the performance of this agreement. COMPENSATION

The maximum that the Contractor can be paid on this contract is \$350,000.00 (hereafter the "not to exceed" amount.). The "not to exceed" amount includes all payments to be made pursuant to this contract, including reimbursable expenses, if any. Nothing in this contract requires the City to pay for work that does not meet the Standard of Care or other requirements of the Contract. The actual amount to be paid Contractor may be less than that amount.

Any estimate of the hours necessary to perform the work is not binding on the City. The Contractor remains responsible if the estimate proves to be incorrect. Exceeding the number of estimated hours of work does not impose any liability on the City for additional payment.

If work is completed before the "not to exceed" amount is reached, the Contractor's compensation will be based on the Contractor's bills previously submitted for acceptable work performed and approved.

REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES

Contractor may be reimbursed, upon advance written approval by authorized City personnel, for certain expenses incurred in connection with personnel assigned to provide services for the City on the City's Site. All invoices shall be accompanied by original receipts and any additional backup that may be appropriate, and required by any subsequent Task/Change Order. Reimbursement will be made based on the following guidelines:

- (a) Commercial Air Travel. Commercial air travel reservations are to be arranged based on the lowest coach fare available within a reasonable time frame surrounding the desired arrival or departure time. The City shall reimburse Contractor for one round trip to the subject work location, unless otherwise agreed to by the City in writing. When possible, air travel arrangements should be reserved at least seven (7) to fourteen (14) days in advance. Direct billing for commercial air travel is NOT permitted; however, City may elect to arrange travel reservations on behalf of Contractor personnel. Weekend travel is not reimbursable, unless otherwise agreed to by the City's Project Manager in writing. In the event weekend travel is reimbursed, such reimbursement shall be made based on an amount up to and in lieu of any authorized per diem amounts and, if applicable, any other daily expense reimbursement.
- (b) Reutal Cars Surface Transportation. Vehicle rental will be reimbursed based on a minimum ratio of one (1) compact auto per two (2) Contractor personnel. Reimbursement for vehicle rental will not be approved for Contractor personnel falling below that ratio. Cost for additional insurance is not reimbursable, nor will reimbursement be permitted for fuel obtained at a vehicle rental agency. City does not assume any liability of any type in connection with rental vehicles reserved or operated by Contractor personnel. Direct billing for rental vehicles is not permitted. If the City's Project Manager elects to provide a per diem for auto rental, such per diem shall be the same per diem as allowed for City employees.
- (c) <u>Lodging</u>. Contractor shall arrange for their own lodging if required, and approved in writing by the City. The City will reimburse Contractor per individual for a daily lodging expenses based on GSA per diem rates; such per diem shall be the same per diem as allowed for City employees. GSA per diem rates can be found at the U.S. General Services Administration website: http://wwyy.gsa.gov/Portal/gsa/ep/home.do?tabId=0,
- (d) Per Diem. The City will provide a Per Diem for each full day (eight hours) worked for Contractor personnel assigned to deliver services. The per diem rate will be the same as the one published on the U.S. General Services Administration website, identified as the Meal and Incidental Expenses (M&IE) for the Portland, Oregon area. Per Diem may include the following expenses:
 - meals
 - laundry
 - · tips and gratuities
 - · communications for personal reasons
 - · any additional miscellaneous expenses
- (e) <u>Personal Entertainment</u>. Expenses incurred for personal entertainment while traveling on the City business are not reimbursable. Personal entertainment includes items such as in-room movie charges, sightseeing, attendance at sporting events, reading materials, birthday gifts, haircuts, etc.

Standard Reimbursable Costs

Expenses incurred during travel will be reimbursed according to the terms outlined the Reimbursable Section above.

Adjustment of Labor Rates Due to Inflation

Annual adjustment of hourly rates will be considered upon written request from the Consultant. Approval of a request for rate increases is solely within the City's discretion and under no circumstances is the City obligated to approve such a request.

Rate increases are subject to the following limitations:

No increases will be granted before the one-year anniversary of the contract;

No more than one increase shall be granted per contract year;

Rate increases may not exceed the then-current average inflation rate for the Portland Metropolitan Area (as determined from the US Department of Labor statistics);

Rate increases shall not be retroactive.

Other than the impact of inflation as described above, hourly rates may not be increased.

Progress Payments

On or before the 15th of each month, the Contractor shall submit to the Clty's Project Manager an invoice for work performed by the Contractor during the preceding month. The invoice shall contain the City's Contract Number and set out all items for payment including, but not limited to: the name of the individual, labor category, direct labor rate, hours worked during the period, and tasks performed. The Contractor shall also attach photocopies of claimed reimbursable expenses, if applicable. The Project Coordinator shall stamp and approve all subconsultant invoices and note on the subconsultant invoice what they are approving as "billable" under the contract. The billing from the prime should clearly roll up labor and reimbursable costs for the prime and subconsultants – matching the subconsultant invoices. Prior to initial billing, the Contractor shall develop a billing format for approval by the City.

The City shall pay all amounts to which no dispute exists within 30 days of receipt of the invoice. Payment of any bill, however, does not preclude the City from later determining that an error in payment was made and from withholding the disputed sum from the next progress payment until the dispute is resolved.

The Contractor shall make full payment to its subcontractors within 10 business days following receipt of any payment made by the City to Contractor.
