#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This Ordinance settles a claim by Terry Kotz for the cost of repairs at his hillside property. The damage to his property was caused by a leaking sewer main in an easement under his home, which is located just off Broadway Drive in Portland's West Hills. The proposed settlement amount is \$26,599. This payment will fully resolve City Risk Claim No. G2012-0420-01.

The sewer main runs down a steep slope in an easement under Mr. Kotz's garage and deck. A leak in that main was first discovered in March 2011. There was some soil settlement at that time, but no damage to the structure of the house. The Bureau of Environmental Services installed a "cured in place" pipe liner to seal the leak. The liner work on the pipe segment under the Kotz house was completed in October 2011. In March 2012, however, a sinkhole developed at the same location as the prior leakage. The sinkhole undermined the supports for his deck and garage. The sinkhole occurred in our easement, and the City was obligated to restore the property to its prior condition. City crews filled the sinkhole, and Mr. Kotz hired a private engineering firm and a private contractor to make the necessary structural repairs. This settlement is for his out-of-pocket costs for that work (less an agreed-upon adjustment for his upgrade of a retaining wall).

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a total payment of \$26,599 from the liability fund. Total settlement amount is \$26,599, less \$5,000 previously advanced by Risk Management.

#### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Terry Kotz property damage claim in the sum of \$26,599.
