#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

On October 17, 2012 Portland Water Bureau crews were working on a construction project in the Sylvan-Highlands neighborhood in SW Portland. Near the conclusion of that project, crews were directed to flush the water main by opening up a fire hydrant located uphill and one house north of the property at 1315 SW 57<sup>th</sup> Avenue owned by Derek Holland. Rather than attach hoses to the hydrant outlets and direct the flow of water to a safe location, crews instead opened two of the four outlets and allowed the water to pour directly out of the barrel of the hydrant onto the ground nearby. A significant volume of water flowed downhill onto the Holland's yard, driveway and into the crawlspace and basement beneath the split-level home. Fortunately Mr. Holland was home at the time and once he realized what was happening, he ran toward the Water Bureau crews and told them to shut the hydrant off. Crews did so immediately, but by that time several feet of mud and water had accumulated in the lower level of the Holland home. It was later discovered that the manner in which storm water runoff historically flowed across this property had been disrupted by erosion from the hydrant flow, and a landscaper had to be brought in to install drains, re-contour the lot, and repair or replace some decking and retaining walls. The Water Bureau found this to be a preventable incident and is accepting liability for these damages.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$13,368.79 from the liability fund.

### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Derek Holland property damage claim in the sum of \$13,368.79.
