#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Rodolfo Ortega owns a home at 2916 SE 85<sup>th</sup> Avenue. On April 15, 2013 at approximately 2:30 PM his home and a house across the street experienced backups of sewage into their basement areas. The backups occurred while crews from PBOT Maintenance Operations were performing routine cleaning of the sewer mains in the neighborhood. Crews had spent much of the day doing preventive maintenance jetting and vactoring of the eight-inch main, and were finishing the segment just upstream from Mr. Ortega's home before ending their day. Crews had noted during the day areas of heavy grease in the lines in this neighborhood, though the source(s) could not be identified. It is believed that crews dislodged some grease or other solid debris in the line with their equipment, and this grease or debris slipped past the normal point of collection in the next downstream manhole, and traveled down to the next sewer main line segment, where it plugged the main. The significant volume of water used in the jetting operation had nowhere to go but up the laterals of the two lowest-elevation laterals on the block.

Mr. Ortega's basement took on approximately 1900 gallons of sewage. Emergency restoration crews later arrived to clean up, dry out, pack up and store contents. An affiliated contractor has submitted bids to restore the basement space to its pre-loss condition. Appliances, including a furnace, water heater and washer/dryer were destroyed and replaced.

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$36,484.33 from the liability fund.

Approve settlement of Rodolfo Ortega property damage claim in the sum of \$36,484.33.
