I. RECOMMENDATION. Extend term of temporary, revocable permit granted to Portland State University for electric car charging stations through February 28, 2015.

II. BACKGROUND. Portland State University (PSU) has requested the City extend the term of its temporary, revocable permit. In August 2011, the City Council granted a 30 month temporary, revocable permit to PSU, through February 2014. PSU, with its partners, Portland General Electric and the City of Portland, created "Electric Avenue." Electric Avenue is a temporary demonstration on SW Montgomery Street and provides valuable research on electric car and charging station use and showcases a variety of electric vehicle charging stations. PSU has requested an extension through February 28, 2015 to allow additional products to be showcased and to provide time for the transition of replacement charging stations.



III.

FINANCIAL IMPACT. There will be no financial impact to the City. The pilot project was not designed to generate revenue for PSU. As part of the demonstration, visitors who use the charging stations to power their electric vehicles will pay only standard parking rates with no premium for electricity. PSU will not charge fees of any kind for the use of the charging stations, and the City will not collect revenue from PSU for this limited and temporary use of the City streets.
