There are formal regulatory requirements for public involvement for biosolids programs in Oregon. All biosolids management and land application plans in the state of Oregon are subject to public participation via Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 340 Division 50. This requires public notice by Oregon DEQ during the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit issuance or renewal process. Opportunity for public review and comment is provided for during this process (last public comment period for the City's biosolids management plan was in 2011). Public notification (i.e., neighbor notification by mail or door-to-door visits) by the permittee is also required when land application sites are proposed for use. Public participation and public notice for the Madison Farms biosolids land application program have been completed by the City of

Public involvement was also solicited by Procurement Services in July 2013 through the posting of the sole source notice on the City's solicitation/vendor website. No interested parties protested or expressed interest in the project through this process.
