5. Purpose of Agenda Item:

This ordinance authorizes an Intergovernmental Agreement (203FLY409) with Portland State University to bring \$75,180 to BPS to provide technical assistance on low-carbon development to the city of Kunming, China. PSU has been awarded a grant by the Energy Foundation to support this work with the understanding that PSU would partner with BPS to provide expertise on carbon reduction and urban planning.

6. History of Agenda Item/Background:

Portland entered in a non-binding EcoPartnership with the City of Kunming, China in May 2012. EcoPartnerships are formal agreements recognized by the U.S. State Department and China National Development and Reform Commission to facilitate subnational collaborations on environmental issues.



Mayor Charlie Hales and Kunming Mayor Li Wenrong affirmed the EcoPartnership in writing in January 2013 and in person in Kunming on October 31, 2013.

Planning and transportation officials from Kunming have participated in previous exchanges with Portland that were organized by PSU, and PSU partnered with BPS and the Mayor's Office to develop a proposal to the Energy Foundation to provide the financial support necessary to pay for all travel expenses and some City staff time. The Energy Foundation awarded the grant to PSU in 2013, and the IGA proposed here would bring \$75,180 of the Energy Foundation resources to BPS.

- 7. What individuals or groups are or would be supportive or opposed to this action? Portland State University, PDC, and firms with expertise in urban planning and low-carbon development with an interest in pursuing work in China are expected to be supportive. There is no known opposition.
- 8. How does this relate to current City policies?

 This work helps implement the City's Economic Development Strategy and leverages the Climate Action Plan by helping Kunming, a large, fast-growing city, draw on its policy priorities and lessons learned.
