Budget Overview for Fiscal Year 2014–15

- Total Budget = \$176.8 million
 - Operating Expenses = \$80.0 million
 - Ongoing reduction of \$1.4 million
 - Capital Improvement Plan = \$96.8 million
 - Reduction of \$14.1 million
- Revenue
 - Rates and Charges = \$149.3 million
 - Retail = \$126.6 million
 - Wholesale = \$16.6 million
 - Other Fees and Charges = \$4.3 million
 - System Development Charges = \$1.8 million
- Full-Time Equivalencies (FTE) = 564.1
 - Reduction of 11 positions



Primary Rate Drivers for FY 2014–15

- Surplus Fund Balance
 - Operating Budget Savings
 - Increased Revenues from Other Fees & Charges
- Inflation
 - Cost-of-Living Adjustments
- Lower Retail Demand
- Operating and Capital Budget Reductions
- ▲ Capital Improvement Plan
 - Distribution system repairs, rehabilitation, and replacements-pipes, hydrants, pump stations, services
 - Reservoir projects
 - Interstate Facility rehabilitation



Rate Summary for Fiscal Year 2014–15

- Retail rate increase –7.0% or \$1.93 per month for typical residential customer.
- System Development Charges-\$2 increase
- Fixed fees and charges-lower
 - Charges for services, mains, and other development fees
 - Lower billable overhead rate
 - Organizational efficiencies




How will proposed rates affect typical customers?

Qualifying low-income residential customers	5	\$13.80	\$14.77	\$0.97
Medium-sized commercial customers	100	\$375.30	\$401.60	\$26.30




Portland water bills represent only 5% of the typical monthly utility services for residential customers.

How do Portland's proposed water rates compare?


