| SUBJECT: | Summary of Comprehensive Plan Public Testimony (Memo 11) |

On April 14, 2015, the Planning and Sustainability Commission (PSC) will have its seventh work session to discuss comments received and reactions to the Proposed Draft. This memo summarizes all public testimony received through March 13, 2015 the close of the public comment period.

## Summary of Comments: July 22, 2014 through March 13, 2015

Between July 22, 2014 and March 13, 2015, a total of 4081 public comments were received. Of these, 2331 were submitted via the Map App, 543 in writing and 762 via email. Additionally, 272 comments were given directly to the PSC at public hearings, and 167 other comment cards were submitted (mostly from the Community Alliance of Tenants and through the Mixed Use Zones project meetings). We have also received over 300 letters from the Argay Neighborhood concerning proposed Mixed Use, Employment, and residential designations.
