ORDINANCE No. 183572

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Oregon, Department of Environmental Quality for administration of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System 1200-Z, 1200-COLS and 1200-A General Permits for stormwater discharges from industrial activities (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Industrial Stormwater Program was originated in 1994 to fulfill requirements in the City's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) permit to monitor and control pollutants in stormwater runoff from industrial facilities.
- 2. To meet this requirement, the City entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) in 1994 with the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to administer the NPDES permits that discharge to the City's MS4. The MOA was revised in 1999 to include industrial facilities that discharge directly to surface waters through private outfalls within the City. To account for the additional permit administration, the MOA provided for revenue sharing of permit fees for all permits administrated by the City. City staff in the program also provide support to other Bureau efforts including source investigation work for the Columbia Slough and Portland Harbor contaminated sediment programs and inspections of other non-permitted industrial properties.
- 3. The City of Portland has committed approximately 1.5 FTEs to management of these additional permits issued to industrial dischargers with direct discharges to surface waters using funds from the Sewer System Operating Fund in each fiscal year budget in the Bureau of Environmental Services Cost Center ESPP000003, WBS Element PUPPSCIS00000BE, Internal Order 9ESPPSC00002.
- 4. This agreement directs funds generated by the management of all permits by the City's Industrial Stormwater Program to be turned over to Portland's Office of Management & Finance by Oregon DEQ in support of state permit management. Revenue generated is estimated to be \$132,000 annually.
- 5. This agreement is to provide for streamlining of administrative procedures between the City and DEQ.
- 6. This agreement will become effective upon signature of approval by the City and the State of Oregon's Department of Environmental Quality. DEQ will finalize the agreement upon signature and distribution of four (4) original documents.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:
