ORDINANCE NO. 183825

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County Health Department to administer the LeadLine, provide free blood lead screening (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. For the purposes of complying with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Lead and Copper Rule for drinking water, the Portland Water Bureau (PWB) funds lead poisoning prevention programs. The PWB will continue to fund a lead poisoning prevention program operated by Multnomah County Health Department (MCHD). Since the year 2000 the MCHD has successfully administered a fully dedicated phone line, the LeadLine, which is a centralized information and referral source for lead poisoning prevention information. The MCHD also provides free blood lead screening through existing immunization services.
- 2. Multnomah County Health Department operates a Lead Poisoning Prevention Program under its Community Health Services Group.
- 3. This agreement is for \$135,000 in FY 2010-11 and not to exceed \$135,000 in FY 2011-12 dedicated for an Intergovernmental Agreement with MCHD for lead poisoning prevention services for the purpose of complying with the EPA's Lead and Copper Rule for drinking water. Funding has been requested in the FY 2010-11 Budget, and will be requested in the FY 2011-12 Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Water Bureau Administrator and Auditor are authorized to execute on behalf of the City an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the Multnomah County Health Department to implement the LeadLine and provide free blood lead screening services in an amount not to exceed \$135,000 per fiscal year for two years in a form in accordance with the IGA attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Water Bureau Administrator and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for said Intergovernmental Agreement up to \$135,000 per fiscal year. The Portland Water Bureau intends to request funds for the agreement through FY 2011-12.

c. Amendments increasing the total compensation of the Intergovernmental Agreement may be agreed to and executed by the Portland Water Bureau Administrator up to twenty-five percent of the total contract amount. Any increase exceeding twenty-five percent of the total compensation would need City Council approval.
