## ORDINANCE NO. 183883

\*Accept a \$30,000 grant from the Oregon Department of Energy's State Energy Program to help pay for Vernon Micro Hydro Turbine at the Portland Water Bureau Vernon Tank Site (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds that:

- 1. On October 28, 2009, the City of Portland adopted a Climate Action Plan (Resolution 36748). The Objectives of the Climate Action Plan directs the city to, among other things, reduce the total energy use of all buildings built before 2010 by 25 percent, reduce carbon emissions from City and County operations 50 percent from 1990 levels, identify funding sources to finance energy-efficiency upgrades in City and County facilities, and convert street lighting, water pumps, water treatment and other energy intensive operations to more efficient technologies.
- 2. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009, Pub. L. 111-5, (ARRA) was enacted by the US Congress to create jobs, promote economic recovery and provide investments needed to increase economic efficiency that will provide long term economic benefits and stabilize state and local budgets. ARRA has provided funds to the Oregon Department of Energy for competitive State Energy Program (SEP) grants for energy efficiency and renewable energy projects benefiting local governments.
- 3. Portland's energy efficiency program for city-owned facilities the City Energy Challenge has worked cooperatively with Bureau managers to identify energy and renewable energy projects to submit for SEP funding. The Portland Water Bureau has identified the Vernon Micro Hydro project as a capital improvement project that convert excess water pressure into electrical energy while reducing carbon emissions and improving the operation at the Vernon tank site.
- 4. The cost of the Vernon Micro Hydro Turbine project is \$335,000. \$30,000 in grant money is available from the Oregon Department of Energy. The remaining \$305,000 will be provided by a combination of additional grants and PWB CIP Budget. \$155,000 will be provided by the PWB, and is available in the FY 2009-10 Budget, and has been requested in the FY 2010-11 Budget.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a \$30,000 grant from the Oregon Department of Energy's State Energy Program (SEP) to help pay for the installation of the micro hydro turbine at the Vernon tank site.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because funding will be withdrawn by the Oregon Department of Energy if the Agreement is not signed by June 11, 2010. Therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
