ORDINANCE No. 184099

*Authorize Intergovernmental Agreements with Columbia Land Trust and SOLV to implement acquisition and restoration activities in the Baltimore Woods Connectivity Corridor as directed by Ordinance No.183822 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On March 8, 2006, the Council adopted the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan, which describes actions for watershed health including citizen led activities such as revegetation, education, involvement and stewardship.
- 2. On April 1, 2010, Metro awarded the City of Portland Bureau of Environmental Services and the Three Rivers Land Conservancy a Nature in Neighborhoods grant for the Baltimore Woods Connectivity Corridor Project in the amount of \$158,000 to acquire and conduct restoration on five key parcels (totaling one acre) within the Baltimore Woods Connectivity Corridor. Three Rivers Land Conservancy merged with Columbia Land Trust in 2010.
- 3. BES has agreed to partner with Columbia Land Trust and SOLV on acquisition and restoration activities on these parcels through the attached Grant Agreements. Columbia Land Trust will coordinate property closings, develop management plans, and oversee restoration activities. SOLV will engage citizens in on-the-ground restoration, stabilization, maintenance, and monitoring activities.
- 4. The established cost is \$40,000. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2010-11 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Elements E10070, E10071, and E10072.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute Grant Agreements with Columbia Land Trust in the amount of \$20,000 and SOLV in the amount of \$20,000 for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute amendments to these Grant Agreements that do not increase the original amount of each agreement by more than 25%.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily postpone the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
