

## ORDINANCE No. 184273

\* Authorize application to the Department of Human Services Regional Offices on Women's Health for a grant in the amount of \$2,500 for activities and events in support of Prevention of Violence Against Women and Girls (Ordinance).

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The City of Portland, along with several community organizations, has been working tirelessly to help support those that are victims of human trafficking and domestic violence.
2. According to the U.S. Department of Justice, a quarter of all sex trafficking victims are 17 years of age or younger.
3. The Portland Police Bureau reports five cases of human trafficking each week and at least two of these victims are juveniles.
4. Portland's marine ports, airports, and proximity to I-5 are all contributing factors to the high numbers of individuals who become victims of human traffickers.
5. While law enforcement, along with other government agencies and community organizations are working together to support and rescue victims of violence and human trafficking, the need for prevention of this behavior has never been greater.
6. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Regional Offices on Women's Health recognizes this need and is contracting with John Snow Incorporated (JSI) to administer a Request for Proposal (RFP) for projects and activities related to the Prevention of Violence against Women and Girls to be administered before August 31, 2011.
7. This is a national effort by government organizations to raise awareness about steps a female can take to ensure her safety, while emphasizing the importance of incorporating self-confidence and preventive and positive relationship behaviors into everyday life.
8. There is a shared responsibility between males and females to conduct constructive and healthy relationships and it is imperative that both genders become aware of preventative actions that can be taken to eliminate violence against women and girls.
9. Commissioners Amanda Fritz and Dan Saltzman, working in partnership with community organizations, intend to organize and provide one workshop for teenage girls and boys focused on preventing violence against women and girls in our community.
10. Partnership organizations that provide services to victims of domestic violence and human trafficking will include: Volunteers of America, Portland Police Bureau's GirlStrength Program, Sexual Assault Resource Center, East Portland Community Coalition Group, and the Gateway Center for Domestic Violence Services.

11. No match is required by this grant

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make an application to the Department of Human Services Regional Offices on Women's Health for a grant in the amount of \$2,500.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.


