ORDINANCE No. 184681

Authorize a three-year Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University in the amount of \$120,000 to execute the Multifamily Recycling Project (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Both the State of Oregon and the City of Portland have adopted aggressive waste reduction goals that rely on increasing recycling for all sectors, residential, multifamily and commercial.
- 2. City Council adopted Resolution No. 36423 which established the following goals for the solid waste and recycling system:
 - promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials, and
 - minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions, and
 - reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015, and maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of the recovered materials.
- 3. As of July 2005, Solid Waste and Recycling Administrative Rules mandate that all recycling and garbage companies collect recyclables from multifamily complexes using a two-sort system.
- 4. Through continuing agreements with City of Portland, Portland State University (PSU) assists in the education, outreach and implementation of a standardized recycling system for multifamily complexes throughout Portland.
- 5. For Fiscal Years 2011/12, 12/13 and 13/14 PSU will continue to provide recycling and waste prevention assistance to multifamily managers/owners and tenants.
- 6. PSU will provide monthly progress reports to the City and hold quarterly meetings with the City.
- 7. The established cost is \$120,000. Funds are available in the Solid Waste Management Fund, approved FY 11/12 budget, Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, Center Code PNSD 000004, Cost Object 9PNSWC0000013. Funds are available for the remainder of the contract.

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a. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to execute an agreement with Portland State University for the purpose described in Section 1, in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, in the amount of \$120,000.

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b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Solid Waste Management Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
