ORDINANCE No. 184745

Authorize Intergovernmental Agreement with Metro to accept \$80,000 for administration of the City Master Recycler Program in FY 2011-13 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

- 1. Metro has notified the City of Portland that it will award a two-year grant of \$80,000 for the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to continue to implement the Master Recycler Program for FY 2011-13.
- 2. Since July 1, 2003, the City of Portland assumed management of the Master Recycler Program from Oregon State University Extension Program. Since 2003, Metro has provided the City annual and then biannual grants to administer the program, which provides an eight-week training course for adults on the solid waste and recycling system. Participants pay back their training by educating others in the community – either by doing special projects or interacting with the public at events, thereby multiplying the program's efforts.
- 3. By Resolution 36423 on June 28, 2006, Portland City Council adopted new goals for a sustainable solid waste and recycling system to:
 - Promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials, and
 - Minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions, and
 - Reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015, and
 - Maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of recovered materials.
- 4. The City's Master Recycler program continues to provide education and outreach to increase public awareness and inspire activities that lead to improved recycling rates in the city. During FY 2009-2011, 164 people completed the Master Recycler Program training and Master Recycler volunteers contributed over 6600 hours of waste reduction education and outreach in the Portland Metro area.
- 5. The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability will provide a match to Metro's grant in the amount of \$40,000 each year for two years, and Clackamas and Washington Counties each will provide \$5,000 each year for two years. BPS's match of \$40,000 is allocated in the FY 2011-12 Adopted Budget, Cost Center PNSD000006.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant in the amount of \$80,000 from Metro for the two-year implementation of the Master Recycler Program from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2013 and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- c. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by Metro for the Master Recycler Program grant, Metro Contract No. 930596, City External Order PN00240001 provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.
