ORDINANCE No. 184922

* Authorize a grant agreement not to exceed \$50,000 to CARES Northwest to perform medical child abuse assessments (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council Finds:

- Since 1987, CARES Northwest has served more than 24,000 children referred for concerns of maltreatment and has developed a reputation for quality child abuse intervention regionally, nationally and internationally. CARES Northwest's mission is the promotion of children's well being through quality child abuse interventions in a multidisciplinary approach with community partners. Services provided by CARES Northwest include: medical evaluation of sexual abuse, physical abuse, neglect and/or exposure to domestic violence, mental health services for children and families, consultation with other professionals on issues of child abuse and neglect, education, and research.
- 2. Currently, the program receives more than 3,000 referrals of children annually for concerns of abuse, neglect, and/or exposure to domestic violence and sees approximately 1,500 children per year in its clinic.
- 3. CARES Northwest is a collaborative program of Kaiser Permanente, The Children's Hospital at Legacy Emanuel, Oregon Health and Science University's Doernbecher Children's Hospital, and Providence Health & Services.
- 4. The CARES Northwest Governing Board is responsible for all policy matters, including approval of annual capital and operating budgets, approval of strategic marketing and fundraising plans, and approval of major service changes.
- 5. In accordance with the City Council's Special Appropriations for FY 2011-12 Adopted Budget, the City now desires to make a grant to CARES Northwest in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby authorized to execute a grant agreement for \$50,000 in one-time funds to CARES Northwest substantially in conformance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A to the original of this Ordinance.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to Special Projects fund when demand is presented and approved by proper authority.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because any delay in providing grant funding to allow CARES Northwest to expeditiously proceed with providing services to the community would harm the public interest; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
