## ORDINANCE No. 185050

Extend term of Olympic Pipe Line Company pipeline franchise to transport petroleum products by pipeline (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 162012)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In June, 1989, the Council granted a franchise to Olympic Pipe Line Company, to use designated streets within the City of Portland to transport petroleum products by pipeline. Ordinance No. 162012.
- 2. The Council previously extended the term of the Olympic pipeline franchise ordinance until December 31, 2011. Ordinance No. 183338.
- 3. Over the last 20 years the Council has granted several petroleum pipeline franchises. City staff has reviewed the terms and conditions of all of these franchises. Staff is working with the petroleum pipeline industry to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of the City's franchises for petroleum pipelines.
- 4. On October 26, 2011, the Council adopted non-emergency Ordinance No. 184957, amending Title 17 of the Portland City Code. Among other matters, the ordinance updated, clarified and reorganized various code sections. The Bureau of Transportation will need to adopt administrative regulations implementing various aspects of the revised code provisions. This process will affect some of the standard franchise language. As the bureau works to complete this process, the Office for Community Technology recommends that the Council extend the existing pipeline franchises.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Ordinance No. 162012 is hereby amended to extend the term of the franchise, continuously and without interruption, through December 31, 2012.
- b. All other terms and conditions of the franchise shall remain the same and unchanged.

c. On or before the thirtieth (30<sup>th</sup>) day after this ordinance becomes effective, Olympic Pipe Line Company shall file in the Office of the Auditor of the City of Portland a written acceptance of this ordinance, executed by Olympic Pipe Line Company, meeting the approval of the City Attorney. Any failure on the part of Olympic Pipe Line Company to file such written acceptance within such time shall be deemed an abandonment and rejection of this ordinance, and this ordinance shall thereupon be null and void. Such acceptance shall be unqualified and shall be construed to be an acceptance of all the terms contained in this ordinance.
