# REMOVE invasive! Plants

Invasive plants crowd out native plants  
and trees, and displace natural habitat.

moist soils to remove the entire root system. For older and larger specimens, a cut stump herbicide\* treatment may control re-sprouting from the base.

**Indigo bush** – Clip flower heads before seed set to limit seed production and distribution. Cut stems will re-sprout so removal must include the roots or re-sprouting plants can be treated with herbicide\*. Since plants grow near water, hiring a professional to implement herbicide applications is recommended.

**Pokeweed** - Cut back the plant and dig out the large taproot (which can be as large as a bowling ball). Followup treatments if plants resprouts from root. For older, larger specimens, a cut stump herbicide\* may control resrouting from the base.

**Tree of heaven** – Hand pull seedlings and dig out sapling roots. Cut down larger trees and grind out the stump. A cut stump herbicide\* treatment can prevent re-sprouting from the roots.

**Spurge laurel** – Wear gloves and long sleeves during removal because the plant sap and berries are toxic. Hand pull small plants when soil is moist to maximize root removal. Use a woody plant puller on larger plants to remove the root. This plant will re-grow from root remnants and suckers.

**Yellow flag iris** - Remove flowers or immature seed pods to limit seed dispersal by water. Continual pulling can exhaust the rhizome, but digging out plants will likely lead to followup treatments because removing rhizomes leaves fragments that re-sprout. **Garlic mustard** – Remove garlic mustard when it's flowering from April to June, and before seed matures in the summer (typically July). Removing plants with brown seed pods is likely to spread the mature seeds. Plants can be pulled, but be sure to remove the roots because they can re-sprout. The root is bent so pull slowly and gently in moist soils for best results.

*\* Inappropriate use of herbicides can be hazardous. Always read labels, and follow safety precautions, or hire a professional.*

## Removing Invasive Plants

Manual and mechanical removal are best for small patches of invasive plants.  
Infestations of more than half an acre may require manual and mechanical methods  
combined with other weed control techniques.

Invasive plants can reproduce from roots and underground stems (rhizomes), which  
must be removed for effective control. Removal is most effective when the soil is  
moist, but be careful not to disturb any nearby native species.

**English holly and English laurel** – Cut with a chainsaw or loppers. Periodically  
cut re-sprouting plants. Applying herbicides on waxy leaves is not effective, but a  
cut stump herbicide\* treatment can control re-sprouting from the base. For more

**English ivy** – Removing berries prevents birds from spreading seeds. Pulling ivy  
and removing roots is effective for small areas. Repeated pulling may be necessary.  
Cut vines all the way around a tree trunk to 4.5 feet from the ground to kill ivy in  
the upper branches. Clear ivy from a six-foot radius around the base of a tree.

**Himalayan blackberry** – Hand-pull, cut or mechanically remove the canes, then dig  
out the roots. Even very small root fragments can re-sprout as new plants.

**Knotweed** – Knotweed reproduces from rhizomes, which must be dug up for effective  
control. Mowing and cutting are not sufficient. This plant also reproduces from  
cut stem fragments so do not leave cut stems on the ground. For information about

**Morning glory (bindweed)** – Hand pull small plants or new infestations. For larger  
infestations, dig up the entire plant, including rhizomes below ground. This plant  
reproduces from stem and rhizome fragments. Followup treatment will be necessary.

**Purple loosestrife** – This plant reproduces from root fragments so the entire root  
system must be removed. Pull plants before seed set because each plant can produce  
100,000 seeds. For large infestations, see additional control methods at  
[www.nps.gov/plants/alien/fact/lysa1.htm](http://www.nps.gov/plants/alien/fact/lysa1.htm).

**Scotch broom** – For plants less than three feet tall, pull up the roots. You can cut the  
stems of larger plants near the ground, but about half of them will re-grow from cut  
stumps, so followup treatments may be necessary. Cut or pull plants before seed set  
from July to September because mature plants can produce 300 seeds per bush and  
seeds persist in the soil for up to 80 years.

**Wild clematis** – Cut vines from tree canopies and dig up roots at the base of the  
vine. Tracing the vine back to the basal clump is easier in winter. For older plants too  
large to dig, a cut stump herbicide treatment may control re-sprouting from the base.

**Butterfly bush** – Pull small plants and be sure to remove the roots. You can cut back  
large plants, but many will re-sprout from cut stumps. Use a woody plant puller in

## WHAT MAKES A PLANT INVASIVE?

Invasive plants have been introduced into an environment in which they did not originate. They lack natural enemies, grow and reproduce quickly, and are able to thrive in a wide variety of conditions. These characteristics allow plants to invade new habitats and out-compete natives, resulting in dense thickets of a single plant species.

## HABITAT

Dense thickets of invasive plants limit native plant diversity which reduces food and shelter for

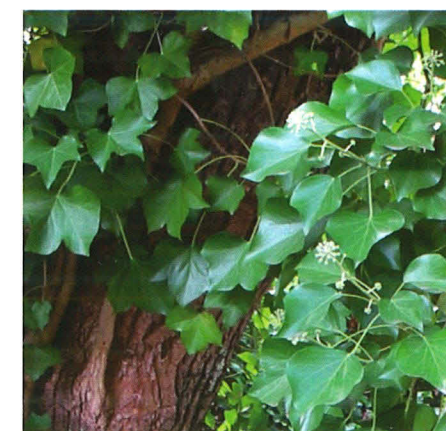

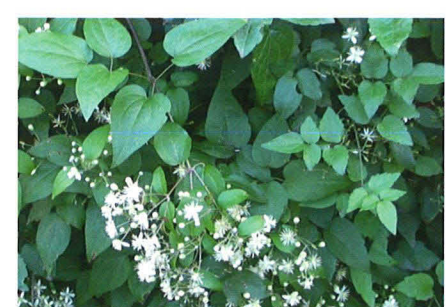
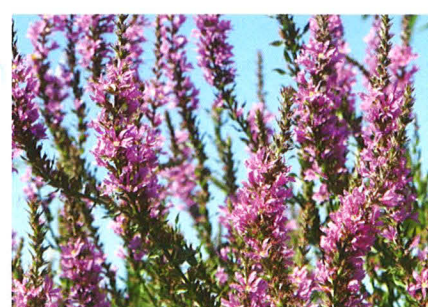

wildlife. Invasive plants are the second leading cause of species extinction.

#### **WATER QUALITY**

Many invasive plants have shallow root systems that provide limited erosion control. Invasive plants also shade out native seedlings resulting in fewer trees. Less shade creates higher water temperatures, reducing oxygen for fish and other aquatic animals. Reduced tree cover also reduces stormwater interception.



#### **English Holly**

*Ilex aquifolium*

Evergreen thicket-forming to 50 feet tall with prickly leaves



#### **Scotch Broom**

*Cytisus scoparius*

Semi-evergreen shrub with yellow pea flowers turning to black seed pods



#### **Purple Loosestrife**

*Lythrum salicaria*

Aggressive perennial has dark pink flowers with square stems



#### **Traveler's Joy**

*Clematis vitalba*

Deciduous twining vine, white spring flowers, with fluffy seedheads in winter



#### **Knotweeds**

*Polygonum sachalinense/P. cuspidatum*  
Perennial with heart-shaped leaves, creates large thickets 10 feet tall



#### **Spurge Laurel**

*Daphne laureola*

Evergreen shrub, pale green flowers in March, berries and sap are toxic



#### **Tree of Heaven**

*Ailanthus altissima*

Deciduous tree to 80 feet with yellow flower, resembles black walnut



#### **Butterfly Bush**

*Buddleia davidii*

Deciduous shrub to 10 feet tall, arching branches have long flower heads



#### **Himalayan Blackberry**

*Rubus armenicus*

Semi-evergreen, thorny canes, 5 leaflets per leaf, more oval than native blackberry



#### **Laurel**

*Prunus laurocerasus*

Evergreen shrub to 30 feet hedge, has glossy tough leaves



#### **Yellow Flag Iris**

*Iris pseudacorus*

Perennial to 4 feet tall, forms dense mats in riparian areas, filling in wetlands



#### **Garlic Mustard**

*Alliaria petiolata*

Biennial with flowers and seeds in second year, basal rosette leaves

### NECK/BACK PAIN [General]

Both neck and back pain are usually caused by injury to the muscles or ligaments of the spine. Sometimes the disks that separate each bone of the spine may cause pain by putting pressure on a nearby nerve. Back and neck pain may appear after a sudden twisting/bending force (such as in a car accident), or sometimes after a simple awkward movement. In either case, muscle spasm is often present and adds to the pain.

Acute neck and back pain usually gets better in one to two weeks. Pain related to disk disease, arthritis in the spinal joints or spinal stenosis (narrowing of the spinal canal) can become chronic and last for months or years.

### HOME CARE:

1. **FOR NECK PAIN:** Use a comfortable pillow that supports the head and keeps the spine in a neutral position. The position of the head should not be tilted forward or backward.  
**FOR BACK PAIN:** You may need to stay in bed the first few days. But, as soon as possible, begin sitting or walking to avoid problems with prolonged bed rest (muscle weakness, worsening back stiffness and pain, blood clots in the legs).
2. When in bed, try to find a position of comfort. A firm mattress is best. Try lying flat on your back with pillows under your knees. You can also try lying on your side with your knees bent up towards your chest and a pillow between your knees.
3. Avoid prolonged sitting. This puts more stress on the lower back than standing or walking.
4. During the first two days after injury, apply an ICE PACK to the painful area for 20 minutes every 2-4 hours. This will reduce swelling and pain. HEAT (hot shower, hot bath or heating pad) works well for muscle spasm. You can start with ice, then switch to heat after two days. Some patients feel best alternating ice and heat treatments. Use the one method that feels the best to you.
5. You may use acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Motrin, Advil) to control pain, unless another pain medicine was prescribed. [NOTE: If you have chronic liver or kidney disease or ever had a stomach ulcer or GI bleeding, talk with your doctor before using these medicines.]
6. Be aware of safe lifting methods and do not lift anything over 15 pounds until all the pain is gone.

**FOLLOW UP** with your physician or this facility if your symptoms do not start to improve after one week. Physical therapy or further tests may be needed.

[NOTE: If X-rays were taken, they will be reviewed by a radiologist. You will be notified of any new findings that may affect your care.]



**GET PROMPT MEDICAL ATTENTION** if any of the following occur:

- Pain becomes worse or spreads into your arms or legs
- Weakness, numbness or pain in one or both arms or legs
- Loss of bowel or bladder control
- Numbness in the groin area
- Difficulty walking
- Fever over 100.0°F (37.8°C)

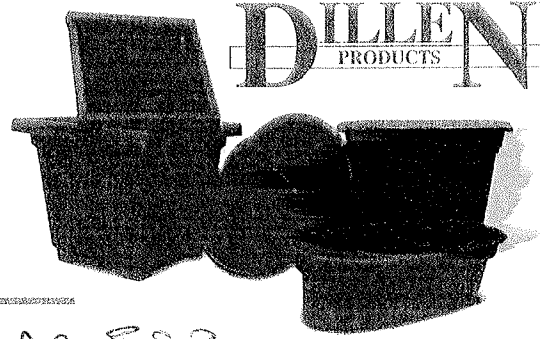

When a person is arrested for a criminal offense, the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office must file with the Court what is called an accusatory instrument charging that person with a crime or crimes. If that person is still in jail custody and an accusatory instrument has not been filed by the time the case is called on the Court arraignment docket, and there are no other charges against that person, that person will be released from jail custody.

If an arrested person has been released from jail custody and appears in Court when required by the release agreement, and if no accusatory instrument has been filed, the person who posted the security deposit is entitled to a refund. The Court will withhold 15% of the security deposit for Court costs. If the arrested person has other financial obligations to the Court on other cases, the Court may apply the security deposit to those obligations rather than return it. (See ORS 135.265)

When no accusatory instrument has been filed by the time of an arrested person's arraignment, it is possible that no accusatory instrument will ever be filed charging that arrested person with any criminal offense or offenses. However, in some cases the District Attorney may file an accusatory instrument at a later time. If this happens in your case, an arrest warrant could be issued and you could be taken into custody again for that same criminal offense. It is only after you have been tried by this Court for that criminal offense that you can claim your right against double jeopardy.

**If you are concerned about the possibility of a criminal offense being charged against you at a later time, you can call the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office at (503) 988-3162 after at least one week to determine whether or not an accusatory instrument has been or will be filed against you.**

If you have property that was taken as evidence by the police officer during your arrest, you can contact that police agency after at least one week for information on how to obtain your property. For the Portland Police Bureau call (503) 823-2179; for the Gresham Police Department call (503) 618-2542; for the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office call (503) 255-3600 ext. 486; and for the Port of Portland Police Department call (503) 460-4221.

**If the arresting police officer issued you any other citations (you would have the yellow "Summons" copy), you must appear in court on the date and time indicated in that "Summons" copy. That citation is charging you with other criminal offenses that were not dealt with today in Court.**

The above named defendant was referred to the Pretrial Services Program on the above listed charges. The referral was for "PSP If Accepted".

**PRIMARY CONSIDERATIONS:**

**Reasonable protection of the Victim/Community:**

Mr. Collins scored 7 out of a possible 10 points on the Virginia Assessment Instrument because of his history of felony convictions, his history of failures to appear in Nevada and Arizona, his history of violent convictions, his chronic homelessness, his lack of employment, and his history of illegal drug abuse.

During his jail interview, Mr. Collins told me he had been homeless for 1 year. He has no family locally. He said he receives mail at transition Projects on NW Glisan Street. By the end of the interview, he said he had been homeless for 2 weeks. On 9/01/2010, Mr. Collins told Recognizance that he had spent 8 days at a homeless camp in Gresham and that he had spent 8 months with a Samoan family. There are discrepancies here.

Mr. Barry Joe Stull has a restraining order, #100868888, against Mr. Collins. The order expires 8/30/2011 and prevents Mr. Collins from interfering, molesting, interfering with, or menacing Mr. Stull. Mr. Collins may not purchase or possess any firearms or ammunition.

Mr. Collins said he uses methamphetamines and marijuana weekly but has not used cocaine for 3 years. He said he has been snorting and injecting methamphetamines since 1994 or 1995. He has not earned a paycheck for at least a year.

**Nature of the current offense:**

Per Portland Police report 10072832, on 9/01/2010 Mr. Collins was arrested near Shell Gas Station at NE Broadway & Williams, for violating a restraining order against Mr. Stull. He had run Mr. Stull out of a camp in Gresham and taken over Mr. Stull's camp.

**Prior Criminal History:**

Per LEDS, in Las Vegas, Nevada, Mr. Collins has convictions for Petit Larceny, Battery, Trespass, Obstructing a Peace Officer, Robbery, Failure to Appear After Admission to Bail, and Battery Domestic Violence. In Flagstaff, Arizona, he has a Failure to Appear 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Conviction. Per PPDS, Mr. Collins has twice been cited for Disorderly Conduct, and he has been excluded from a Portland park.



**Factors to consider indicating the possibility of violations if released:**

Mr. Collins has no local ties or references. He is actively abusing marijuana and methamphetamines. He has no residence and has not earned a paycheck for over a year. He has a history of failures to appear in Nevada and Arizona. He has 2 violent convictions.

**Facts indicating an appearance in Court (FTA history):**

Per LEDS, Mr. Collins has 2 failures to appear.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

I recommend against Mr. Collins' release to Pretrial Services.

#### Review

I attended Mr. Stull in 1980, when then in his mid-twenties, Mr. Stull underwent a lumbar laminectomy (Dr. W. Parsons, Legacy/GSH, 1980) for a herniated disc. THE disorder and extensive surgery left him with a residual chronic lumbar pain, for which over the years, smoked and ingested cannabis successfully control back pain in the intervening years to the present.

As examination revealed, he has a denervated skin zone in the L4-S1 dorsal sensory rami (see mapping) fields over the lower right back into the upper buttock which, the focal zone of his long-standing pain, viz. a post-deafferentiation central neuropathic pain syndrome

\* \* \*

In the past 12 months a series of lamentable events have occurred in which in he lost his position as a warehouseman, got involved in a bitter eviction struggle with a landlord who had all of his belongings removed and destroyed--including his marijuana plants (Mr. Stull has a medicinal marijuana license), and he was forced back onto the street to perform as a street musician --busker.

He remains in an intense struggle over the loss of his files and materials, and came to day to see if I would provide him in this extremely stressful period in his life with a prescription for two MARinol tablets (to be used when the pain and nausea became too intense, while he gets his marijuana plants back into a base of service.

#### Examination

Ambulatory with much facial hair, articulate, appearing to be well nourished, intelligent and articulate, he rode here today on his bicycle is ambulatory without a limp lost. or widening of his base.

Stretch reflexes are 1+/2- and asymmetric at the knees; the R ankle jerk is 2+ the left ankle jerk is absent even with reinforcement. There are no signs or symptoms of sciatica.

I re-examined his lower back region (see enclosed mapping), demonstrating again a long, well-healed midline lumbar lower/thoracic scar of approximately 20 cm length, with a zone of pin/light touch sensory loss with allodynia, in the territory of the right lumbosacral dorsal sensory dermatome territory from approximately L4 through S1 extending inferiorly over the ipsilateral buttock--corresponding to a chronic, post-surgical ventral de-afferentation neuropathic pain zone as described.

Plan: I have asked Mr. Stull to (1) obtain the State of Oregon's Medical Marijuana License form for me to sign.

#### Pain management

(ii) Given that stress amplifies his pain, I have provided a small prescription of 60, 1 mg lorazepam tablets to help him get by with his increased pain and nausea until he can get cannabis use back on line.

(iii) After my exam and review of his situation, I have also provided a prescription for two 2.5 mg Marinol tablets for periods of intense pain and nausea until his medical supply of medical cannabis is more secure.

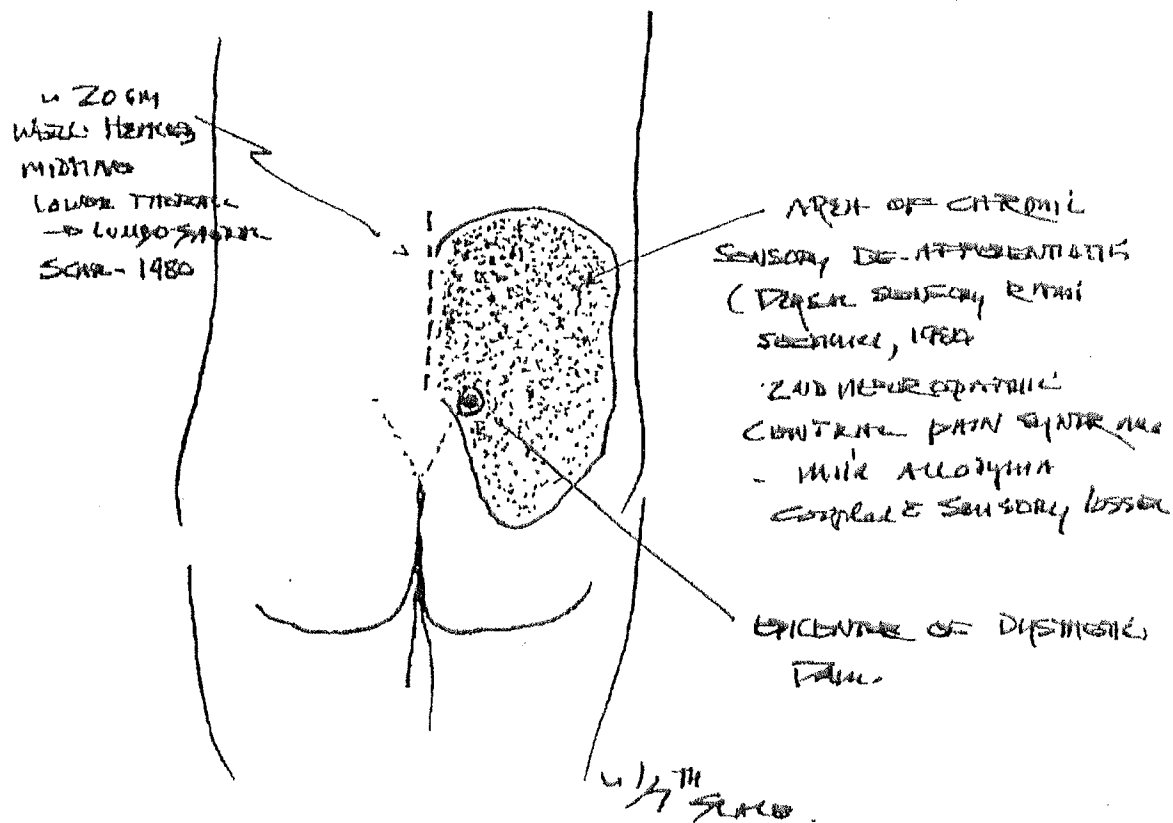

At this writing, Barry reports that is homeless, is living on the streets, and unemployed. He looks healthy, is alert and organized in his thinking, with a nice sense of humor. He is here seeking my help for maintaining his Tri-Met *Honored Citizen* status, with a needed statement on my part is some statement from me on the expected duration his of his condition.

And BS was also informed he was no longer eligible with the Transition Projects, Inc that he was not eligible for 3 for their expedited Social Security Benefits program.

However, BS avoided losing his shelter living circumstances by obtaining enough of my *dronabinol* Rx to have have federal license to test positive for THC on urinalysis.

Barry reports he is re-activating his non-profit Cannabinal Research Institute, and reports, he has been drafted as an instructor on hemp history, "The struggle that is life continues."

On this date, he provided me with a letter (11-20-07) reflecting on the social consequences of his courtroom struggles in the past few years which, as he says: have . . . exposed every level of corruption in the legal system, from attorneys to the courts, to the Oregon State bar, the police, the sheriff, and the Mult Co District of Attorney. He goes on to list the various deprivations on his rights at many levels of the system which ends up depriving of the ability to make a living and to seek away out of his homeless situation.
