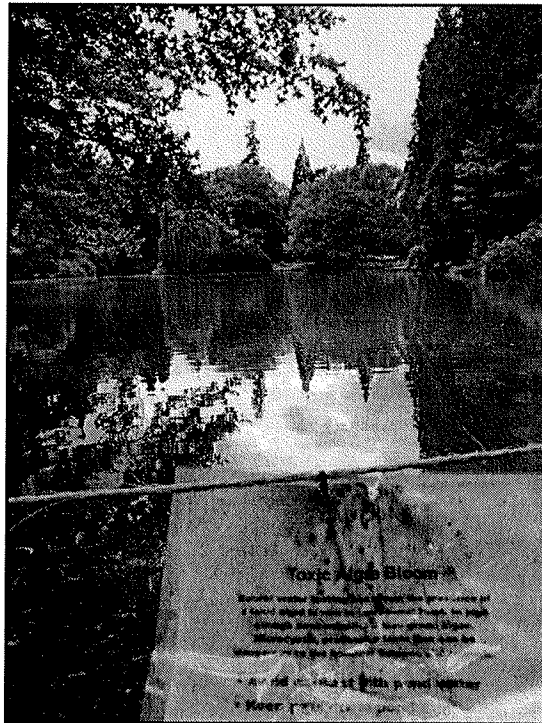

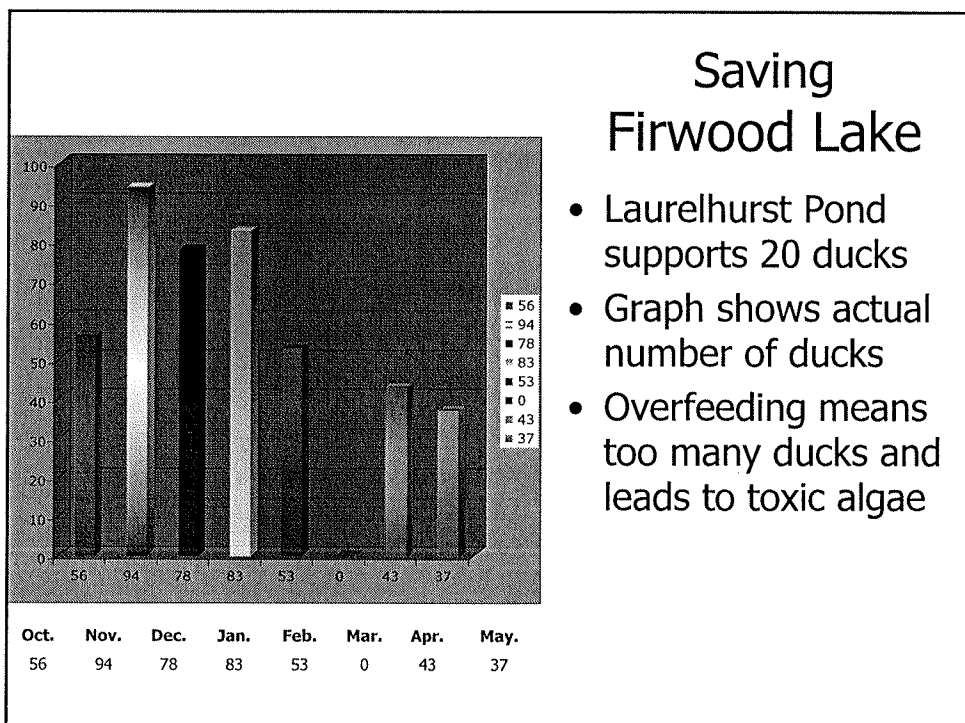

- City solution is to dredge
- SES solution is public education
- Do not feed the ducks!

- Overfeeding means too many ducks and leads to toxic algae


