Framed award certificates are presented to the individuals and work groups that were nominated by their peers and managers and a handsome monogrammed jacket will be awarded to the Safe Drivers.

The recognition by the Mayor and Council Members has been well received by the employees and work groups and has greatly advanced the efforts to improve safety and loss prevention within the City.

Commencement at 2:00 pm
Reception and refreshments to follow in the main foyer after the event

Welcome and opening remarks by Mayor

1. Awards will be stacked on the Testimonial Table by bureau/department. A tent label will be on top of each stack identifying the Mayor or Commissioner to whom it belongs to (a corresponding summary will be given to the Mayor/Commissioner ahead of time so that they will already be familiar with each award).
2. Lying on top of each award will be a note card with the script the Mayor/Commissioner will read about the recipient (same language as in the bureau summaries mentioned in Item #1 above).
3. The Mayor/Commissioner will come to the Testimonial Table to present his/her corresponding awards. Order of presentations:
 - Mayor Adams
 - Commissioner Fritz (standing in for Commissioner Saltzman)
 - Commissioner Leonard
 - Commissioner Fish
4. The Mayor/Commissioner will call the recipient up to the floor and read the script on the note card.
5. The Award Recipient will come to the testimonial table when called to receive recognition.
6. The Recipient and Mayor/Commissioner shake hands.
7. During the handshake, or shortly after, a photograph will be taken.
8. The recipient exits and the next recipient is called up to the floor.
9. When the Mayor/Commissioner is finished with his/her awards, he/she goes back to his/her place at the panel and the next Commissioner will come to the Testimonial Table - so on and so forth.
10. When the last Commissioner is done with his framed certificates, we will begin recognizing the Top Safe Drivers. The order of presentations will be the same as for the Certificates.
11. Lonnie Turner will hand the Mayor the script with the Driver's name. The Mayor will call the driver to the testimonial table and read the script. After the script has been read, Lonnie will hand the Mayor the Driver's jacket. The Mayor will put the jacket onto the driver. The Mayor and Driver will shake hands and be photographed. Lonnie will usher the Driver to the back of the testimonial table for a group photograph of all Safe Drivers together with Council.
12. When the Mayor is finished with all of his Top Safe Drivers, Lonnie will usher him and the driver to the stand with the other top driver(s).
13. Lonnie will cue the next Commissioner to come forward and repeat Items 10 and 11.
14. When all Council members and Top Safe Drivers are standing together, we will take a group photograph.
15. Kate Wood will make closing remarks and invite the attendees to take refreshments in the lobby area outside of Council Chambers

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SAFETY COMMITTEES: Maintenance Operations

Met all requirements and duties of a safety committee including, but not limited to:

- upgrading of the sweeper wash area,
- identifying speed problems on North. Kerby Ave. and installing permanent speed controls
- addressing snow and ice safety issues leading to training program for the entire bureau,
- developed safety procedures for fuel containers.

This committee has worked hard to increase its availability to all Bureau employees and continues to build safe work programs.

SAFETY CHAMPION: Don Davis, AEOII, in the Street Maintenance Division Don has had a profound influence on identifying the areas of Workzone Traffic Control that need to be most emphasized in our training program. He has shown a willingness, as a trainer, to listen to concerns of diverse workgroups and make safety suggestions that upgrade the workplace safety of our entire workforce at Maintenance.

SAFETY CHAMPION: Darrell Warren, UWI, in the Street Maintenance Division. Darrell is a repeat nominee from last year. He was nominated again this year at the insistence of our Maintenance Operations Safety Committee primarily because they feel that he continues to go far beyond the norm in the leadership he shows in setting up and teaching others to set up safe workzones.

SAFETY SOLUTIONS: Scot Weaver, Environmental Services Division Supervisor, and Tim Langdon, Maintenance Mechanic. After receiving a number of new trucks in our fleet, it was noted that the hydraulics needed to be tested and adjusted in order to insure safe operation. This meant the coordination of a number of work crews, timely scheduling, and a thorough understanding of the adjustment issues. Scot and Tim stepped up and made sure that this process was carried out, and most importantly, averted any potential accidents by facilitating a timely fix to the problem.

SAFETY SOLUTIONS: Keith Orr, Electrical Supervisor. Identified a process that enabled Maintenance to upgrade and insure ongoing maintenance of our 1st Aid Kits and outside Eye-Wash Stations at all of our locations.

SAFETY SOLUTIONS: Mike Park, Public Works Supervisor II, and Ted Harvey, Concrete Finisher. Both of these employees play leadership roles in our Sidewalk Repair Section. They have given extraordinary effort to improve the safety culture in their work group. An example of some these efforts are there increased daily safety communication with their work team, and there relentless influence to include safety in all work discussions.

SAFE DRIVER: Allyne Grimm

Allyne has been with the City since 9/18/86. He works as an AEO II, working on the night crew as Sweeper Operator, receiving occasional upgrade to Night Supervisor. He also works as an informal trainer with new members of the night crew and is highly respected for his driving skills and his ability to share safe driving tips with his fellow employees.

Scott is an active member of the Wastewater Group Safety Committee and a regular contributor to thoughtful safety ideas. Good follow-up is one of his strong suits in addition to his solid work ethic.

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SAFETY COMMITTEE:

2009 was a year of big changes for the Bureau of Development Services. In May 2009, BDS Inspections Division Manager Jim Nicks took initiative to help employees effectively address verbal threats of physical harm and violence. Because the bureau's work involves enforcing land use and construction laws, customers have been known to occasionally become angry and upset.

Last May, Jim was notified that a customer in the building was making veiled threats to some employees. Jim immediately took action by informing the Portland Police Bureau and BDS staff about the potentially dangerous situation. Jim took the safety of the employees very seriously, and made sure that all precautions were taken and preventative measures were enacted, should that customer return to the building again or call for service at an off-site location.

After successfully diffusing that encounter, Jim worked with the Safety Committee to raise employee awareness about policies and procedures for effectively dealing with threatening people. Thank you, Jim Nicks, for demonstrating your care and concern for BDS employees!

OUTSTANDING SAFETY CHAIRPERSON:

Kathy Saunders, Development Services Code Specialist III, has been an active member of the BDS Safety Committee since January, 2007. In June of that year, Kathy became an official member, and then on January 14, 2009, she was elected Chair. Earlier this year Kathleen was one of BDS' presenters at this year's Citywide Safety Committee Bootcamp.

During her first year as Safety Committee Chair, Kathy has become known as a "get it done" leader. She has helped to build safety awareness among BDS employees by being willing to ask employees their thoughts and ideas about safety issues and following-through on their ideas and suggestions.

Kathy brings high energy, tenacity and an impressive commitment to helping BDS employees remain safe and healthy. Thank you, Kathy Saunders, for a job well done!

LIFE SAVING

The City of Portland's Noise Control Officer, Paul van Orden, was working with Portland Police at a "Last Thursday" event on NE Alberta Street in August 2009, when he had cause to take immediate action to protect the lives of citizens in the area.

The "Last Thursday" monthly event attracts over 10,000 people during the warm summer months. The street closes to automobiles, as a safety precaution.

On August 27, a motorist suffering from heat stroke lost control of his Suburban and crashed through a road closure barricade at the "Last Thursday" event, nearly striking Paul. Paul reacted quickly to halt the incoherent motorist from driving past the barricade into a street filled with pedestrians. Then he telephoned Portland Police for assistance and helped secure the area.

Paul clearly took initiative well above and beyond his routine professional responsibilities. This incident was just one of the many ways Paul van Orden has distinguished himself while serving the citizens of Portland.

SAFE DRIVER: Bill Pettis

Bill Pettis has worked for the Bureau of Development services since 1998, when he started as an Electrical Inspector. He has been a Combination Building Inspector since 2001. Inspectors at the Bureau of Development Services average more than **9,000 driving miles per year**. During his successful tenure at BDS, Bill has become an accomplished professional, having earned five new professional certifications in the past two years and successfully completing more than 80 hours of professional development training. Jeff developed and implemented numerous training programs and has presented frequently at city-wide safety events and conferences. His leadership in safety training and program development were instrumental in his attaining a recent promotion to Training Analyst

The bureau is pleased to recognize Shon for his dedication to safe work practices and the safety of others. Shon:

OUTSTANDING SAFETY COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON: Gary W. Egan, CAD Analyst

Gary is the Co-Chair for Water Bureau's Portland Building Safety Committee. Gary has raised the bar for the committee's dedication and performance by increasing its participation in safety events such as "Take a Break for Safety" and Bureau Wide Safety Committee Meetings. Gary used his personal time and energy to complete the Professional Safety Development Program with Oregon OSHA, receiving his certificate of completion last November. Gary also has challenged fellow committee members to complete this program and incorporated portions of the on-line training into their safety committee meetings. Thank you, Gary, for all of your efforts to elevate the interest and participation in the Water Bureau's safety program.

LIFE SAVER: Jeff Farrell, Lead Water Security Specialist

Jeff was locking up Washington Park one night when he heard police dispatched to a suicide attempt in the park. A distraught man stated that he was going to kill himself by inhaling CO fumes from his vehicle's exhaust. Portland Police was unable to find the man or his vehicle, cleared the call and left. While driving through the park, Jeff spotted an idling vehicle that had a hose connected to the tail pipe and routed into the car's occupant compartment. Jeff immediately notified Water Bureau's dispatch center of the find, then opened the car up and pulled the man out. The victim was disoriented and most likely would have died if Jeff hadn't taken immediate action to get him out of the vehicle.

LIFE SAVER: Robin Hagedorn, Office Support Specialist III

Another employee at the Portland Building suffered a bad fall in one of the stairwells. Robin was quick to summon medical attention for the injured employee, ensure that the front desk reception was aware to direct the medical crews and rendered first aid to the victim until medical crews arrived. Robin, your concern and actions for the welfare of others is much appreciated, thank you.

LIFE SAFETY & EMERGENCY RESPONSE:

Sandy River Crew, Andrew Degner, Steve Schenk, Jamie Teatsworth, Todd Evers, Alan Boschee

A mechanical failure caused a city employee to lose control of his truck and drive into Reservoir 2. The truck was completely submerged. The driver was able to exit the vehicle and go to the Headworks facility where he received help from the treatment operators. The Sandy River Station's crew took immediate action to contain the truck's contents and safely removed the vehicle from the reservoir within 4 hours after the incident. The driver escaped with minor injuries and the Bureau did not have to shut-off water to the conduits. We thank these employees for exemplifying such timely, professional and safe emergency response and life safety.

SAFE DRIVER: Brian J. Bowles, Construction Equipment Operator

During his tenure, Brian has not had any accidents nor any category 1 traffic crime violations. Brian is a CDL and can be relied upon to operate his equipment safely.

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
