ORDINANCE No. 185365

Amend Intergovernmental Agreement with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to partner on salmon and lamprey monitoring program for Tryon Creek basin (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30001882)

The City of Portland ordains:

The Council finds: Section 1.

- 1. In March 2000, the Portland City Council adopted the Clean River Plan, which included monitoring and watershed assessment to determine project effectiveness and partnering with other jurisdictions.
- The Portland City Council adopted the Framework for Integrated Management of Watershed Health on March 8, 2006 as part of the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan. The Framework defines healthy urban watersheds and watershed health goals including biological communities. Salmon are highlighted because of their special legal, economic and cultural status in the Pacific Northwest.
- 3. The United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) works with partners to conserve, protect and enhance fish, wildlife, and plants and their habitats for the continuing benefit of the American people.
- 4. On December 15, 2010, the Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) and USFWS agreed through an IGA, Ordinance No. 184323, to partner for five years to monitor salmon and lamprey presence in the Tryon Creek Basin to study stream enhancement effectiveness and determine needs for future projects. The established cost was \$53,000.
- 5. BES and USFWS agree through this amendment to extend the timeline, budget and scope of the project to include additional monitoring at Tryon Creek between the Highway 43 culvert and the Willamette River confluence. Fish species community and abundance estimates will be conducted monthly instead of once per year. Additionally, temporal use of Tryon Creek by juvenile salmon and steelhead will be conducted once a week for 3 months in the spring/summer. Additional funds of \$53,709 over five years are available in the Tryon Creek Confluence Project Effectiveness Monitoring budget E10319 for FY 12-13, FY 14-15 and FY 16-17. The new not-to-exceed agreement amount is \$106,709.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute an amendment with USFWS for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$53,709.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
