One provision of the proposed Code is to provide for improved enforcement of conduct and fare regulations. Fare evasion results in lost revenue for the streetcar and an erosion of service. TriMet is ending the free rail zone and Portland Streetcar is expanding our current service area. These changes are projected to increase fare revenues. To ensure that we realize the projected increase in revenues it is important to provide the proper tool for fare inspection and to preserve the current assets or the system.

a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Fare evasion and safety on the streetcar were important issues raised during the Public Involvement process to evaluate the proposed Streetcar Fare Policy as part of the fare policy discussion. The community asked City Staff for tools and increased attention to address fare evasion and safety issues on the streetcar system

Streetcar staff will be able to provide greater customer service. In addition, the adoption of these proposed rules will provide for a more unified regional transit experience for our riders.

While discussing proposed changes in the fare policy, the issues of fare evasion and improved customer service were repeatedly highlighted by the community. The need to have a uniform code of conduct for transit in region and the adoption of clear rules of behavior on the streetcar was consistently referred to in that process. These rules are a direct result of that feedback.

Yes. The attached code will periodically be updated and reviewed by the PSI and CAC boards. These proposed changes are supported by the community who asked Portland Streetcar to establish a code of conduct and revise the Streetcar fare policy. The proposed code provides clear rules, enforcement authority and opportunity for appeal. They are based on the TriMet rules of conduct and provide the opportunity to be amended.

As part of the public information about the opening of new service in September 2012, Portland Streetcar will educate the public about the changes to the fare structure, the new routes and the expected code of conduct.
