I. RECOMMENDATION

Bureau staff recommends passage of the proposed Code amendments. These amendments move current ordinance authorities into a new Code section where they can be easily referred to and enhance clarity for citizens. This is a companion piece to the BES Code Clean-up Ordinance filed for the same Council hearing.

<u>NOTE</u>: According to the City Attorney's Office, Charter section 1-104 requires a minimum of four votes in order for Council to delegate its authority to dispose of Cityowned property. Therefore, if four favorable votes are not obtained, this ordinance will not pass.

II. BACKGROUND

This package was developed over the last three months by staff from PBOT, the City Attorney's Office and BES. A number of ordinances were passed by Council over the years granting authority to the Bureaus with regard to City property interests. Because these delegations were not codified, the public and sometimes staff are not necessarily aware that they exist. It is far preferable to have them in the Code.

In addition, other relatively minor actions involving City property interests require Council involvement and, in the view of staff, an undue expenditure of Bureau resources. With appropriate limits, those authorities can and should be delegated as well.
