ORDINANCE No.

*Delegate authority to charge-off housing loans originated through the Portland Development Commission and/or the Portland Housing Bureau. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City consolidated the housing functions that existed at the City and the Portland Development Commission (PDC) through Ordinance No. 182465 on January 7, 2009, and established the Portland Housing Bureau (PHB).
- 2. It is important to establish clear delegations of authority and regular reporting requirements so Council and the community are aware of the financial assistance PHB provides.
- 3. The City, through Resolution No. 36787 on May 19, 2010 and Resolution No. 36796 on June 23, 2010 established financial assistance guidelines for PHB.
- 4. The City, through Ordinance No. 183836 on May 26, 2010 and Ordinance No. 183932 on June 23, 2010, delegated authority to review and approve financial assistance under Council-adopted guidelines to PHB and established the Housing Investment Committee (HIC) to review and recommend approval or rejections to the PHB Director of loans and grants for any of the financial assistance guidelines adopted.
- 5. The PHB Director and Commissioner in Charge are authorized to approve or reject financing under the guidelines-of up to \$2 million and \$3 million, respectively. The PHB Director is authorized to approve or reject, subject to HIC's review and recommendation, a loan or grant up to \$100,000.
- 6. Loans previously approved by PDC under the PDC loan guidelines, and during more robust economic times, transferred to PHB.
- 7. PHB wants to reconcile the expectations for repayment of these loans with the city's need for sound financial reporting.
- 8. In order to ensure the long term health and viability of affordable housing projects and the loan portfolio itself, PHB requires the authority to charge-off loans where repayment is determined to be unlikely.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Housing Investment Committee (HIC) is hereby authorized to review charge-offs for any of the financial assistance guidelines adopted via Resolution No. 36787 and No. 36796 and recommend approval or rejection to the PHB Director.

- b. PHB will work in consultation with the City Chief Financial Officer in making loan charge-off decisions.
- c. The PHB Director can execute loan charge-offs following the thresholds designated on Exhibit A- Portland Housing Bureau Charge-off Approval Designation.
- d. PHB will provide a quarterly summary of charge offs to the City Chief Financial Officer.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because delay in delegation of authority to charge off housing loans would interfere with the long term health and viability of affordable housing projects; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
