This ordinance will support improved vehicle conditions for wheelchair accessible for-hire transportation vehicles. Standard vehicle age limits for all vehicle types with age requirements also provides equity amongst the different types of transportation providers.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The Private for Hire Transportation Board of Review discussed and approved this legislative item. Board members include representatives of TriMet, permitted transportation companies and drivers, and the riding public.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Private for-Hire Transportation Board members representing the riding public brought forward concerns about the condition older of wheelchair accessible vehicles currently in service. The Board held public meetings and discussed potential implementation of new vehicle age standards. A gradual implementation plan was developed to allow the affected businesses time for adequate financial planning for purchase of new vehicles. Implementation was delayed one year, and those purchasing vehicles until January 1, 2013 may continue to utilize those vehicles under a longer maximum age limit. Also at the request of permitted businesses and Board members, the Board recommended making vehicle age maximums standard for all vehicle types with age limits. This provides consistency and equity between providers of different types of transportation services.

7. BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS

This ordinance creates standard age requirements for private for-hire transportation vehicle categories that have vehicle age limits under current City Code. The ordinance allows a more gradual implementation of the vehicle age requirements authorized in 2009. At the request of permitted operators, the Private for-Hire Transportation Board reviewed inconsistencies in vehicle age requirements for taxis, shuttles, executive sedans, specially assisted transportation, and wheelchair accessible vehicles. On September 28, 2011, the Board found executive sedan maximum vehicle age limits should be consistent with those of taxis, shuttles, and specially assisted transportation vehicles (10 years). On March 28, 2012, the Board found that the 15 year vehicle age limit for wheelchair accessible vehicles was insufficient to adequately regulate the condition of these vehicles. After substantial discussion with all industry segments, a 10 year vehicle age maximum for wheelchair accessible vehicles was recommended. The Board also recommended that implementation of vehicle age requirements include a provision to allow the 15 year age limit to apply to all wheelchair vehicles purchased prior to January 1, 2013, in order to allow adequate financial preparation for vehicle replacement.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

This legislation has no financial impact to the General Fund.

9. RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED

The Bureau respectfully requests that the ordinance be passed in order to provide consistent and adequate standards for maximum vehicle age limits in regulated for-hire vehicle categories.
