Dear Mayor Adams, Neil and Bruce:

The Portland Business Alliance is concerned with the current disagreement between the city of Portland and TriMet regarding funding sources for the student bus pass program. I served on the TriMet General Manager's budget task force and am aware of the very tough budget decisions that TriMet is facing.

We appreciate Mayor Adams' intent to find a way to continue to provide bus passes to students; this is a critical benefit to students that cannot otherwise afford a bus pass or alternative transportation options. However, we are concerned that raising fees in this manner to address such an issue is not appropriate use of the city's fee setting authority.

We also recognize the severe budget shortfall that TriMet is facing and both the General Manager and the TriMet Board of Directors' responsibility to prioritize essential transit services for the entire spectrum of ridership. These are not easy decisions to make; and we appreciate the complexity of issues that the agency is dealing with.

At the same time, however, it was our understanding that the Mayor and TriMet had an understanding regarding the continuation of the high school bus pass program and elimination of Fareless Square. Somehow, however, the situation got muddled. We urge the city and TriMet to work together to resolve this through a compromise. We also believe that the affected school districts should be at the table to help identify a solution to this matter.

The Alliance must point out that the current disagreement is over a small amount of resources relative to a budget problem of large magnitude. The real issue that TriMet and the community should be addressing is the unsustainable TriMet employee benefit costs and their increasing impact on TriMet's ability to provide service. We urge the city and TriMet to come to resolution regarding the student bus pass program immediately and turn the focus to finding a solution to the issue of TriMet's much greater problems.

ORDINANCE No.

*Revise transportation fees, rates and charges for FY2012-2013 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Approved Budget for the Bureau of Transportation for FY2012/13 requires adjustments to fee rates and charges for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 2012.
- 2. Transportation has consolidated all fee rates and charges into schedules as set forth in TRN-3.450 Transportation Fee Schedule and Exhibits A, B and C. The consolidated schedules do not preclude the establishment and/or continuation of fees, rates and charges by resolution, ordinance, Code provision or administrative rule, not otherwise specified in the Ordinance.
- 3. In accordance with City of Portland Finance Policy 2.06, "The City will maximize and diversify its revenue base to raise sufficient revenue to support essential City services and to maintain services during periods of declining economic activity. City services providing private benefits should be paid for by fees and charges as much as possible to maximize flexibility in the use of City general revenue sources to meet the cost for services of broader public benefit. The City's overall revenue structure will be designed to recapture some of the financial benefits resulting from City economic and community development investments. Revenue collection efforts that produce positive net income for City service delivery will be the highest budget priority. Bureaus that primarily or exclusively operate with non-General Fund revenue will minimize reliance on General Fund support for discrete programs that are not supported with fees."
- 4. Ordinance No. 185351 passed by Council May 23, 2012 approved the Bureau of Transportation's fee rates and charges.
- 5. A fee related to encroachments and use of the right of way as shown in Exhibit C has been revised since adopted under Ordinance No. 185351.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Bureau of Transportation shall follow the fees, rates and charges in accordance with the FY2012/13 budget, beginning July 1, 2012, as set forth in Exhibit C, attached to this Ordinance.
- b. TRN-3.450 Transportation Fee Schedule Exhibit C of this Ordinance is adopted as binding city policy.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists to have the revised fee rates and charges effective July 1, 2012 to align with the fee rates and charges set forth in Ordinance No. 185351; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
