#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

During the 2012 legislative session, the Oregon Legislature passed other legislation which revises portions of ORS Chapters 279A, 279B and 279C collectively known as the "Public Contracting Code." The City's Social Equity Contracting Strategy was adopted by City Council on July 19, 2012 as Resolution #36944 which required Procurement Services to make amend City Code as necessary. Additionally, housekeeping changes and minor technical corrections have been included as part of this update. The following is a synopsis of the substantive changes for PCC 5.33 and PCC 5.34:

- a. Definitions: Provides for a definition for "amendment" and "change order" as is in general use.
- b. Modifies the Authority of Directors to more completely reflect the process that is in general use and not conflict with Chief Procurement Officer's authority.
- c. In accordance with ORS 279B as passed by the 2012 legislature, a preference when procuring goods that are fabricated or processed entirely within this state, or services that are performed entirely within this state has been included.
- d. Clarifies that an evaluator's exercise of judgment is not grounds for protest.
- e. Clarifies the business with which a City employee is associated.
- f. Includes a reference to the Social Equity Contracting Strategy as required by Resolution #36944, adopted July 19, 2012 and includes:
  - Increased the Requirement for bid security and performance and payment bond to \$150,000.
  - Modified the prequalification requirements to allow for electronic filing and to standardize City processes.
- g. Clarifies prequalification protest and appeal process.
- h. Clarifies post-project evaluation process.
