## ORDINANCE No. 185925

\* Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County to increase compensation for outpatient treatment and supportive housing to chronic offenders identified by the Services Coordination Team (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30002795)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The chronic recurrence of crime diminishes neighborhood livability and negatively impacts the community's perception of safety.
- 2. There is a causal relationship between substance abuse and the commission of crime.
- 3. If housing and treatment programs were more available for those offenders with the greatest need for and potential to benefit from treatment, a decrease in related crimes is predicted.
- 4. It is most cost effective to purchase residential treatment beds with non-profit organizations through an arrangement with Multnomah County; since these contracts and mechanisms for monitoring services already exist.
- 5. Multnomah County manages a contract with Volunteers of America to provide these housing and treatment services.
- 6. There is a one-time, General Fund appropriation to support this agreement in the FY 2012-13 Budget sufficient to fund the program for eight months. The bureau and the Office of Management and Finance worked with community partners and identified \$204,360 as the balance of funding required to keep the program fully operational for the entire fiscal year.
- 7. The cost of this amendment is \$204,360. This amount was appropriated in the FY 2012-13 Fall Budget Monitoring Process.
- 8. It is in the public interest that this agreement be amended without delay to prevent a lapse in this beneficial program.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to amend the agreement in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.
- Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because delay in proceeding with this agreement will unnecessarily deprive the City and the County of the mutual benefits of the agreement. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
