# ORDINANCE No. 186012

\*Authorize a three-year Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University in the amount of \$132,937 to implement Portland's Public Event Recycling Program 2013-2016 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On April 30, 2008, City Council adopted Resolution No. 36601 that established the following goals for the commercial solid waste and recycling system:
  - Promote sustainability of the solid waste and recycling system that includes maximum efficiency, equity and economic vitality, improved worker safety and reduced environmental and human health impacts over the entire life cycle of the materials;
  - Minimize the impact of harmful wastes by targeting toxicity and reducing greenhouse gases emissions;
  - Reduce per capita waste generation below 2005 levels by the year 2015; and
  - Maximize recovery of all waste with a target of 75% by the year 2015 and promote highest value use of the recovered materials
- 2. Both the State of Oregon and the City of Portland have adopted aggressive waste reduction goals that rely on reducing garbage and increasing recycling for all sectors residential, multifamily and commercial.
- 3. Portland's Public Event Recycling Program provides information, resources and equipment to facilitate recycling, food scrap composting and waste prevention activities.
- 4. Portland State University (PSU) wil support all of the major, annually scheduled permitted events at Waterfront Park, Pioneer Square and the Park Blocks through technical assistance and vendor education and outreach. PSU also will support all interested community events by providing technical assistance, vendor education and outreach and recycling containers.
- 5. The established cost is \$132,937. Funds in the current year are available in the Solid Waste Management Fund, FY 2012-2013 budget, Bureau of Planning and Sustainability. Funds will be requested for the remainder of the Agreement.

### NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor is authorized to execute an intergovernmental agreement with PSU in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A to this Ordinance for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of up to \$132,937.

b. The Director of Bureau of Planning and Sustainability of the City of Portland is authorized to negotiate and execute on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications to the agreement provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists to allow work to continue that benefits the City's goals for waste reduction and recycling. Therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
