#### 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The Utility License Law, City Code Chapter 7.14, assesses a tax rate upon utilities operating within the City, including the Bureau of Environmental Services and the Portland Water Bureau. In September 2004, City Council passed an ordinance to amend the Utility License Law and to limit annual utility license fee payments made by the Bureau of Environmental Services and the Portland Water Bureau. Ordinance No. 178717. The purpose of the ordinance was to gradually reduce the annual water and sewer utility license fee payments from 7.5% to 5% of gross revenues. Water and sewer utility license fees have now reached the point where their actual fee payments equal 5% of gross revenues. The water and sewer utility license fee rates should be amended to 5% of gross revenues to reflect the actual rate being paid. This amendment fulfills the Council's original direction from 2004.
