#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The purpose of this ordinance is to ratify a Letter of Agreement between the City on behalf of PF&R, Exhibit A attached hereto, that amends Article 8 to provide for a six percent premium for employees who serve on a Technical Rescue Team and who are assigned to Station 12. The 2012-2016 CBA only provides for premium pay for employees who serve on a Technical Rescue Team and who are assigned to Station 1. The City and PFFA entered into the LOA to be better prepared for emergencies on the east side of the Willamette River.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The additional costs resulting from this ordinance are the six percent premium pay for up to 12 employees who hold the Technical Rescue certification and are assigned to Station 12. The costs for the remainder of fiscal FY 2013-14 are estimated at \$22,480 and the annual costs are approximately \$68,440 plus inflation in the future. These costs will be absorbed through vacancy savings within PF&R's service level budgets going forward.

#### 9. <u>RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED</u>

I recommend that the Mayor and City Council approve this ordinance.

#### LETTER OF AGREEMENT

The parties to this agreement are the City of Portland (City), on behalf of the Bureau of Fire & Rescue (Bureau), and the Portland Fire Fighters Association Local 43 (Union).

#### Background

- 1. At the present time the Bureau has one Technical Rescue Team responsible for Urban Search and Rescue (USAR).
- 2. Article 8, Section C, Subsection 8 Technical Rescue Team, provides a six percent premium to certain employees serving on this team.
- 3. To qualify for the team an employee must be assigned to Station 1, (8) (a), and meet the DPSST requirements in six areas, (8) (b).
- 4. To be better prepared for emergencies, the Bureau is planning to place additional Technical Rescue resources on the east side of the Willamette River.

#### Agreement

1. The parties agree to amend the current labor agreement under Article 8, Technical Rescue Team to provide:

Technical Rescue Team. Certain employees who perform additional work by serving on the Technical Rescue Team shall receive a premium of six (6) percent. To be eligible for this premium, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- a) be serving on the Technical Rescue Team and assigned to E-1, T-1, S-1, or E-12, The number of employees receiving this premium shall not exceed a maximum of 16 per day: 12 employees assigned to E-1, T-1 and S-1; and 4 employees assigned to E-12; *and*
- b) meet DPSST requirements for  $all^{\ell}$  of the following:
  - 1. Rope Rescue
  - 2. Trench Rescue
  - 3. Confined Space Rescue
  - 4. Vehicle/Mechanical Rescue
  - 5. Structural Collapse Rescue
  - 6. Tunnel Rescue

(c) Further, the bureau may require that incumbents to such assignments successfully pass an annual evaluation based on criteria established by the Bureau. The PFFA shall have the opportunity to give input through the Labor Management Committee into the development of the evaluation process.

2. This agreement will become effective with its approval by City Council via the ordinance process.

# **ORDINANCE No.**

\*Ratify a Letter of Agreement between the City on behalf of Portland Fire & Rescue and the Portland Fire Fighters Association Local 43 authorizing the expansion of Technical Rescue Teams under the collective bargaining agreement (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The City and the Portland Fire Fighters Association (PFFA) are parties to a collective bargaining agreement effective July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2016 (the 2012-2016 CBA).
- 2. PFFA is the sole and exclusive bargaining agent for the purpose of establishing wages, hours and conditions of employment for probationary and permanent employees employed at Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) in the classifications listed in Schedule "A" of the 2012-2016 CBA.
- 3. Article 8 of the 2012-2016 CBA provides for a six percent premium to certain employees serving on the Technical Rescue Team, so long as the employees are assigned to Station 1 and meet DPSST requirements in six areas to qualify for the six percent premium.
- 4. On February 5, 2014, the City on behalf of PF&R entered into a Letter of Agreement (LOA), Exhibit A attached hereto, that amends Article 8 to provide for a six percent premium for employees who serve on a Technical Rescue Team and who are assigned to Station 12. To qualify, the employees must meet certain DPSST requirements. Incumbents may be required to pass an annual evaluation based on criteria established by PF&R with input provided by the PFFA,through the Labor Management Committee. The LOA has been approved as to form by the assigned Senior Deputy City Attorney.
- 5. The City and PFFA entered into the LOA to be better prepared for emergencies on the east side of the Willamette River.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The LOA between the City on behalf of PF&R and PFFA attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference is ratified by this Council.
- b. PF&R is authorized to fund the cost for the expanded premium pay for serving on a Technical Rescue Team at Station 12 from its current service level budget for the remainder of the 2013-2014 fiscal year and from PF&R service level budgets going forward.
- c. This ordinance is binding City policy.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to avoid an unnecessary delay in the orderly implementation of the provisions of the LOA; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


