Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- To permit City Council to continue to partner with the community and the USDOJ to achieve full compliance with obligations of Settlement Agreement including community engagement provisions and to clarify appropriate role of court.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

- Financial impacts will be minimal, such as court filing fees, and will not require any budget changes.
- No long term financial impacts from this Resolution.

Community impacts and community involvement:

This Resolution will permit the City to continue to work directly with the Albina Ministerial Alliance Coalition, Community Mental Health Advocates, the USDOJ, the PPA and others to ensure that there is robust community engagement in the work of the Portland Police Bureau. The City is committed to active and meaningful public involvement in the development of a new Community Engagement Plan for PPB, and believes that continual status conferences before the Court will only detract from that work. Because this Resolution directly concerns only the technical legal issue of whether the Court has discretion to order more than annual status conferences in the absence of a notice of breach, no public involvement has occurred specifically related to that narrow issue.
