

ORDINANCE No.

188099

* Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with eligible parties for the Sharing of Emergency Operations Center Personnel within the Greater Portland Metropolitan Region when personnel are unable to get to their normal reporting location (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The purpose of the Shared Worker Intergovernmental Agreement is to authorize, facilitate and establish conditions and provisions for the sharing of qualified Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Personnel amongst the Parties during emergencies where transportation routes are disrupted and EOC Personnel are unable to report to their normal work locations.
2. This Intergovernmental Agreement is entered into, pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 190.010 to 190.030 and Revised Code of Washington (RCW) Chapter 39.34, by and among counties and cities, inter-local agencies, regional governments, and special districts within Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, and Washington counties in Oregon and Clark County in Washington.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with eligible parties, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, upon approval to form by the City Attorney.
- b. The Director of the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) is authorized to execute amendments to the Shared Worker Intergovernmental Agreement on behalf of the City of Portland, so long as such amendments do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any amendments that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay is likely to impair the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the Intergovernmental Agreement if a need should exist. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effective from and after its passage by Council.


