### **IMPACT STATEMENT**

Legislation title:	* Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with eligible parties for the Sharing of Emergency Operations Center Personnel within the Greater Portland Metropolitan Region when personnel are unable to get to their normal reporting location (Ordinance)
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### Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This Intergovernmental Agreement authorizes, facilitates and establishes conditions and provisions for the sharing of qualified Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Personnel among the participating municipalities during emergencies in which transportation routes are disrupted and EOC Personnel are unable to report to their normal work locations.

Pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 190.010 to 190.030 and Revised Code of Washington (RCW) Chapter 39.34, eligible parties to the Shared Worker Intergovernmental Agreement include counties and cities, inter-local agencies, regional governments, and special districts within Clackamas, Columbia, Multnomah, and Washington counties in Oregon and Clark County in Washington.

EOC Personnel are participating agency employees and qualified emergency service volunteers responsible for various activities occurring within an EOC. EOC Personnel may be full-time emergency management personnel or other personnel from the participating agency, or qualified emergency service volunteers who augment the EOC during emergencies and are trained to regional standards.

### Financial and budgetary impacts:

There are no financial and budgetary impacts of this legislation. Any amendments to the Shared Worker Intergovernmental Agreement that increase the financial obligation or risk must be authorized by City Council.

In the event of a regional emergency in which EOC Personnel are unable to report to their normal work locations due to transportation route disruptions, any incurred expenses are anticipated to be reimbursed through a federal Emergency Declaration. The City would be reimbursed for costs of any workers loaned to other Parties of the Shared Worker Intergovernmental Agreement by the Parties to which it loans staff.

#### Community impacts and community involvement:

This legislation supports resilience and disaster recovery in the City of Portland. Additionally, it enhances the City's the ability to operate Emergency Operation Centers and to serve all communities of people in the event of a regional disaster.
