






# PORTLAND TRAFFIC DEATHS 1996-2015








#### HIGH CRASH NETWORK

O = TOP 30 HIGH CRASH INTERSECTIONS







## TAKING ACTION

#### 5.3

Improve street design to support safe speeds in conjunction with posted speed reduction on four to six streets annually in the High Crash Network, prioritizing improvements in and engaging with Communities of Concern


