ORDINANCE No. 188141

Authorize a competitive solicitation and contract with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for construction of the Whitaker Ponds Entry Improvements Project for an estimated \$606,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) promotes health, livability, and economic vitality through the effective management of the city's award-winning parks and recreation system.
- 2. PP&R seeks to improve access to the Whitaker Ponds Nature Park for nature education and nature-based recreation according to the 2006 Whitaker Ponds Master Plan, accepted by the Council in March 2007.
- 3. In 2014, PP&R applied for and received a Nature in Neighborhoods Capital Grant from Metro to partially fund development of access improvements at Whitaker Ponds entrance on NE 47th Avenue. Ordinance 186835 was approved by the Council in October, 2014 to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement between Metro and PP&R to implement the access improvements.
- 4. PP&R seeks Council's authorization for Procurement Services to issue a competitive solicitation and execute a contract for the construction of the Whitaker Ponds Entry Improvements Project.
- 5. The improvements that will be constructed under this contract include parking for vehicles and school busses, internal pathways, a staging area for school groups, and stormwater improvements. All improvements will be fully ADA accessible and developed in an environmentally responsible manner.
- 6. The construction cost estimated provided by ESA Vigil-Agrimis, Inc. is approximately \$606,000.
- 7. PP&R's confidence level in the cost estimate is medium due to the high demand currently prevailing within the commercial construction market.
- 8. Funding for this project is included in the PP&R FY17 and FY18 budgets. The Project will be funded from a Nature in Neighborhoods Capital Grant from Metro and Parks System Development Charges.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council Directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to facilitate the use of the competitive solicitation process in order to obtain the most responsible and responsive offer for the construction of the Whitaker Ponds Entry Improvements Project.
- b. Upon Council acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's Report, the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office.
