ORDINANCE No. 188156

*Authorize a grant agreement with Janus Youth Programs, Inc. for \$66,000 to help sustain the Village Market in Portland (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Janus Youth Programs, Inc. is a non-profit corporation operating a neighborhood grocery store in Portland.
- 2. Janus Youth Programs, Inc.'s village market provides access to healthy, affordable food for over 400 customers a day who are residents of New Columbia and the Portsmouth Neighborhood and employs ten shift leads and grocery clerks from the same areas.
- 3. Janus Youth Programs, Inc. works in partnership with community leaders to create additional opportunities for advancing equity in a community disproportionately impacted by poverty and hunger.
- 4. Janus Youth Programs, Inc.'s mission is consistent with Council desire for equity and inclusion, promoting job growth, contributing to a complete neighborhood, and helping promote healthier people.
- 5. The FY2016-17 budget includes funding in the General Fund Special Appropriations for the above grant. The City now desires to make a grant to Janus Youth Programs, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$66,000.
- 6. The City's Comprehensive Financial Management Policies, FIN 2.04-Budget, states that grants should be issued after a competitive application process, unless Council waives the policy in the grant ordinance. Since Janus Youth Programs, Inc. is the only organization providing this service, a competitive application process was not implemented for this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement, as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A, at a cost not to exceed \$66,000.
- b. The City Council waives the competitive application process required in FIN 2.04-Budget.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver payment chargeable to the Fiscal Year 2016-17 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in funding would delay Janus Youth Programs, Inc.'s ability to sustain the market and respond to the needs of this community; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
