I fully support the inclusion on the Do Not Buy list of Caterpillar and the banks involved in funding the DAPL. And while I stand here to appeal to you based on my personhood and the small part I play in the fight (la lucha) for our rights, I would also like to remind you of our own shared human experience – the breath we take, the love we have for those around us, our mothers, our fathers, our families, and ask that you divest from private prisons in order to reinvest in humanity.
