## ORDINANCE No. 188214

\*Authorize grant agreement with New Buildings Institute in the amount of \$26,968 to implement the Climate Action Plan building energy actions (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds that:

- 1. In March 2016, the U.S. Department of Energy Office issued a Funding Opportunity Announcement titled, "Cities Leading through Energy Analysis and Planning (Cities-LEAP)".
- 2. The City's 2015 Climate Action Plan (adopted by Resolution 37135) includes an objective to "reduce the total energy use of all buildings built before 2010 by 25 percent" by 2030 (Climate Action Plan, Objective 1, page 64).
- 3. The City and Multnomah County, working together with many individuals, and community and business partners, have reduced local carbon emissions 21 percent since 1990 while adding population and jobs; on a per person basis, carbon emissions have decreased more than 40 percent since 1990.
- 4. Ordinance 187730, adopted May 11, 2016, authorized the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to apply for the U.S. Department of Energy Cities-LEAP funding solicitation.
- 5. BPS prepared an application in collaboration with Portland-based non-profit organizations Earth Advantage and the New Buildings Institute and with the support of Portland State University and the Energy Trust of Oregon.
- 6. The Portland team's application was one of only three nationally to be awarded funding.
- 7. On September 21, 2016, Council accepted a Cities-LEAP grant in the amount of \$322,201 from the U.S. Department of Energy to implement the Climate Action Plan building energy actions (Ordinance No. 187990).
- 8. The funding will enable Portland to analyze the reports submitted under the Commercial Building Energy Performance Reporting policy as part of a larger data set that includes building characteristics and permit history.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is authorized to enter into a Grant Agreement with New Buildings Institute as outlined in form substantially similar with the agreement attached as Attachment 1, upon approval to form by the City Attorney.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay invoices in the amount of \$26,968 chargeable to PN000071 for the Fiscal Years 2016-17, 17-18 and 18-19.
- c. A competitive bid was not submitted for these funds because New Buildings Institute is designated as a sub-recipient in the U.S. Department of Energy grant award to recognize the essential technical capabilities they bring to the project team. The City Council hereby waives the competitive application process for grants as required in FIN 2.04 Budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists so that the City and New Buildings Institute can meet the timelines in the grant award from the U.S. Department of Energy. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
