
Dear Sir:

Such lists should cover the special war agencies and the official, civic, social, religious, educational industrial and other organizations in your city that are reaching or can reach foreign-born people.

We have no record of having received a reply to this communication and, in the press of other duties, its importance may have been overlooked.

The work of uniting America back of our army and navy and in our industries is vital and your cooperation in promptly furnishing the lists requested will be of the utmost assistance in this work.

Dear Sir:

You are respectfully requested to furnish this committee at your earliest convenience with a list of the organizations in your City that are doing Americanization work, with the name and address of the President in each case. This should include all agencies dealing with immigrants, whether official, public, private, religious or industrial agencies.

This Committee also desires the names and addresses of all organizations of foreign-born residents of whatever description.

Americanization as defined in this inquiry includes; instruction of immigrants in the English language and in civics; furnishing information, aid and service to immigrants; the counteraction of anti-American propaganda; meetings, addresses and gatherings to bring about unity of immigrant peoples in America; maintenance of information centers; the adoption of safeguards against alien enemy activities; special attention or provisions for immigrants, and all measures and plans having for their object the bringing of native and foreign-born peoples together in common loyalty to America.

A prompt compliance with this request will be appreciated.
