ORDINANCE NO. 188272 As Amended

*Authorize a contract with Confluence Engineering Group, LLC in the amount of \$664,930 for the Corrosion Control Treatment Pilot Project (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Water Bureau will retain the professional, technical, and expert services of a
 water quality and engineering consultant to perform a corrosion control treatment
 pilot. The corrosion control treatment pilot will evaluate treatment alternatives for
 improved corrosion control treatment to further reduce lead at customer taps and
 provide a recommendation for full scale implementation of improved corrosion
 control treatment.
- 2. City Procurement advertised Request for Proposal WTR 00000462 in support of the Corrosion Control Treatment Pilot (Project) and received one proposal. The proposal was submitted by Confluence Engineering Group, LLC who was deemed a responsive and qualified proposer for this Project.
- 3. The selection process was conducted in accordance to Chapter 5.68 of the City Code.
- 4. The contract term is for two years. The contract amount is \$664,930 with a moderate confidence level.
- 5. There are a limited number of firm's capable of performing the specialized work required for this Project. The estimated average Oregon State certified disadvantaged, minority, women, and emerging small businesses (DMWESB) participation on this contract is 18.63% of the total subcontract dollars.
- The City acknowledges that further improved corrosion control treatment should reduce lead levels at customer taps. The City acknowledges that their goal is to implement improved corrosion control treatment.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. That the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to execute on behalf of the City a contract with Confluence Engineering Group, LLC to perform a corrosion control treatment pilot in a form substantially in accordance with the contract attached as Exhibit A.

b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver checks chargeable to the Water Fund when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists so the work can commence immediately given the importance of this issue to the community; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
